Placement Exams for this Major:

 MAT 1010 will fulfill the math requirement for this major. You can register for MAT 1010 regardless of your SAT/ACT score. However, your major suggests starting your Science Inquiry (SI) in your first semester and most SI courses require a <u>Math Placement Test</u> score or exemption based on SAT/ACT scores. If your SAT/ACT MAT was less than 550/22, take the online Math Placement test as soon as possible and prior to registering for classes.

First-Year Student Course Recommendations:

- 1. R C 1000 or UCO 1200 if there are seats available. If not, it's fine to take both classes in the spring semester.
- 2. Enroll in HIS 2201 and/or HIS 2204 in your first year.
- 3. Students are encouraged to enroll in the classes below that count towards GenEd and the major.
 - a. PS 1100 American National Government and Politics (3) [GenEd: SS]
 - b. <u>PS 2130 State and Local Government (3) [GenEd: SS]</u> or <u>PS 3430 North Carolina Politics (3)</u> (Preferred Course)
 - c. HIS 3524 World Economic History (3)
 - d. CTE 1590 Personal Money Management (3)
 - e. PSY 3010 Psychology Applied to Teaching (3)
- 4. Choose a **Science Inquiry Theme. Enroll in one Science course (Must have math prereg).
- 5. Quantitative Literacy Course MAT 1010 or higher
- 6. 1-2 credit hours of Wellness Literacy
- 7. A <u>Foundations of American Democracy</u> course (HIS 1200, HIS 2525 or HIS 3728 completes this requirement).

*Note that some science courses need to be taken sequentially (in order). Do not choose Chemistry Connections or Physics with Calculus. These Inquiries are designed for those majors only.

 - All English Literary Studies: ENG xxxx (LS) designation courses have a prerequisite of R C 1000, First Year Writing (R C = Rhetoric & Composition.)

Alternative Courses for Your First Semester:

Can't get into the classes above? Try these:

- Choose <u>classes in the General Education Categories and Designations</u> area to satisfy the Sustainability and Climate Literacy (SCL), Intercultural Literacy (ICL), and Humanity and Its Systems (HUM) categories.
- Choose <u>classes in the General Education Categories and Designations</u> area to satisfy the Fine Arts (FA), Historical Studies (HS), Literary Studies (LS), and Social Science (SS) designations.
- Choose a Social Studies elective: PSY 1200, REL 1110, SOC 1000, GHY 1020, GHY 1040, GLS 2000, SOC 1100.

**Consider a LSE course or an ILE theme that carries a designation of HS (Historical Studies), FA (Fine Arts), or SS (Social Science). Note: The English (ENG) LS designation courses have a prerequisite of RC 1000.
