

*The following chart is a review of common verbs which take **gerund** or **infinitive***

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Remember: in structure VERB + OBJECT + INFINITIVE (we always use INFINITIVE)

E.g.: He asked ME to come earlier.

I don't allow coming to class late. (Elena said) -> no OBJECT, we use GERUND.

I don't allow **MY STUDENTS** to come to class late. -> OBJECT (my students), we use INFINITIVE.

I asked to open the door. Verb + infinitive

I asked **Bogdan** to open the door. Verb + **OBJECT** + infinitive
