This placement offers hands-on experience in strategic project management within a national public health organisation, providing exposure to real-world decision-making, governance and stakeholder engagement.</p>
<p><b>Outline of duties:</b></p>	<p>During the placement, the researcher will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>Project manage a selection of digital and data projects</b>, supporting them through the agile delivery lifecycle.</li> <li>● <b>Engage with a wide range of stakeholders</b>, building strong working relationships and supporting effective communication across teams.</li> <li>● <b>Manage risks, assumptions, issues and dependencies (RAID)</b> to ensure projects remain on track and are well-governed.</li> <li>● <b>Monitor and report on project progress</b>, preparing updates and documentation for senior audiences.</li> <li>● <b>Deliver presentations to the CDO Portfolio Board</b>, summarising project status, challenges and recommendations.</li> </ul> <p>This role provides a unique opportunity to understand how digital and data capabilities are developed and governed within a major public health agency, and how evidence-based decision-making supports national health security.</p>

<b>Support for Postgraduate Researcher:</b>	<p>UKHSA is an excellent placement host as we have a developed culture of learning and development, fostered in an inclusive environment. To ensure that the postholder has opportunities to expand their skillsets and to develop professionally, we can provide some training in analysis, where required, but we also encourage the researcher to engage with subject matter experts and other early career researchers (ECR) across the UKHSA.</p> <p>At UKHSA, we have a thriving ECR network led by our CDO Partnerships team. The researcher will have the opportunity to join and be supported by the ECR network within the UKHSA, and by other ECRs and team members within the host team. The ECR network has fortnightly meetings to bring learning and development opportunities to placement students as well as quarterly away days at our head office.</p>
