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### **INTRODUCTION**

Submitted research papers must strictly follow the IMRaD structure comprising Introduction, Methods, Results, and Discussion, along with an abstract, references, and optional appendices if needed. The entire paper, including tables and figures, should not exceed 15 pages, formatted on A4-sized paper, with single line spacing, and 1-inch margins on all sides. Use Times New Roman font, size 12-point. Citations and references must adhere to the latest APA (American Psychological Association) citation style. Submissions must be in editable Word document format (.doc or .docx).

The Introduction should provide a clear and concise background of the study, establish the research problem, and explain why the study is important. It should include a brief review of related literature to show what is already known about the topic, identify gaps or unresolved issues, and lead logically to the purpose or objectives of the study. Clearly state the research question or hypothesis, and avoid unnecessary broad statements. The discussion must remain focused on the specific topic being addressed. All references must be properly cited using the

most recent edition of the APA (American Psychological Association) citation style. Ensure that all in-text citations are included in the reference list.

## **METHODOLOGY**

The Methodology section must provide a clear and detailed account of how the research was conducted to ensure transparency and reproducibility. It should begin by identifying the research design (e.g., descriptive, experimental, correlational, qualitative) and justifying its appropriateness for addressing the research objectives. Describe the participants or respondents, including population size, sampling method, inclusion/exclusion criteria, and relevant demographics. Explain the research instruments used (e.g., questionnaires, interview guides, observation tools), including how they were developed or sourced, and how their reliability and validity were established. Clearly outline the data collection procedure, including when, where, and how the data were gathered. ## **RESULTS AND DISCUSSION**

The Discussion section follows the Results and provides interpretation, analysis, and implications of the findings. This section should explain the meaning of the results in the context of the research questions and existing literature. Compare your findings with those of previous studies to highlight similarities, differences, or new insights. Discuss possible explanations for unexpected outcomes and acknowledge limitations that may have influenced the results. Where appropriate, suggest practical applications, theoretical contributions, or areas for future research.

Ensure that the analysis is logical, coherent, and evidence-based. All cited studies must follow the most recent APA citation format.

### Tables Format

Tables should be used to efficiently present numerical data and summarize key results that support the discussion. Each table must be numbered consecutively (e.g., Table 1, Table 2) in the order they appear in the text and must be referenced in the body of the paper.



As shown in Table 2, several key fears and concerns were identified among La Trinidad public market vendors regarding the use of cashless payment systems. These fears emerged through interconnected themes, each significantly influencing the vendors’ reluctance to adopt digital transaction methods. Foremost among these concerns were security issues. Vendors expressed a *strong fear of scams and hacking*, often citing real-life examples of fraudulent experiences within their community. This reflects the general anxiety surrounding the safety of cashless systems.


### Figures Format

## CONCLUSIONS

Authors are encouraged to highlight how the findings contribute to existing literature or address the identified research gap. New data or ideas that were not previously discussed in the paper should not be introduced at this stage. The conclusion must be written in a clear, objective tone and kept brief, typically no more than one to two paragraphs.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

The Recommendations section should be derived logically from the conclusions and provide practical and actionable suggestions based on the study's results. These may include proposals for improvements, policy recommendations, educational applications, or community-based actions. In addition, researchers may suggest directions for future studies, especially to address limitations encountered or areas that remain unexplored. Recommendations must be clear, specific, and relevant to the stakeholders and context of the research.

## REFERENCES

The References section should include all works cited within the research paper and must follow the latest edition of the APA (American Psychological Association) citation style. Entries should be listed alphabetically by the last name of the first author. All references must be accurate, complete, and consistently formatted. Each citation should include all necessary details such as author(s), publication year, title of the work, source or publisher, and DOI or URL when applicable. The reference list should only contain sources that were actually cited in the body of the paper. In-text citations must exactly match the corresponding reference list entries. Use a hanging indent for each reference.
