2. Summarize and describe the back-and-forth between Paris and Juliet. What excuse does Juliet offer to secure time alone with Friar Laurence? (4.1)
  
3. What is Juliet's demeanor when she first speaks to the Friar? What does she seek from the Friar? (4.1)
  
4. What solution does the Friar offer to Juliet? (Be specific.) What is her reaction? (4.1)
  
5. How will the Friar let Romeo know of their plan? (4.1)
  
6. When Juliet returns to her father, what attitude does she take? What surprising news does her father announce? (4.2)
  
7. Who first discovers Juliet's body in the morning? (4.5)
  
8. Describe Juliet's parents' reactions to her apparent death. Focus on contrasting their words and attitudes with those spoken earlier and on the imagery and language Capulet uses to describe Juliet's death (4.5)
  
9. Summarize the Friar's words to the Capulets upon seeing their mourning (4.5)
