The variety of fonts available on computers today stems from a choice Steve Jobs made to add font choices to early Mac computers. While in college, Jobs took a calligraphy course. He later said, "I learned about serif and sans serif typefaces, about varying the amount of space between different letter combinations, about what makes great typography great. It was beautiful, historical, artistically subtle in a way that science can't capture, and I found it fascinating" (Source).
