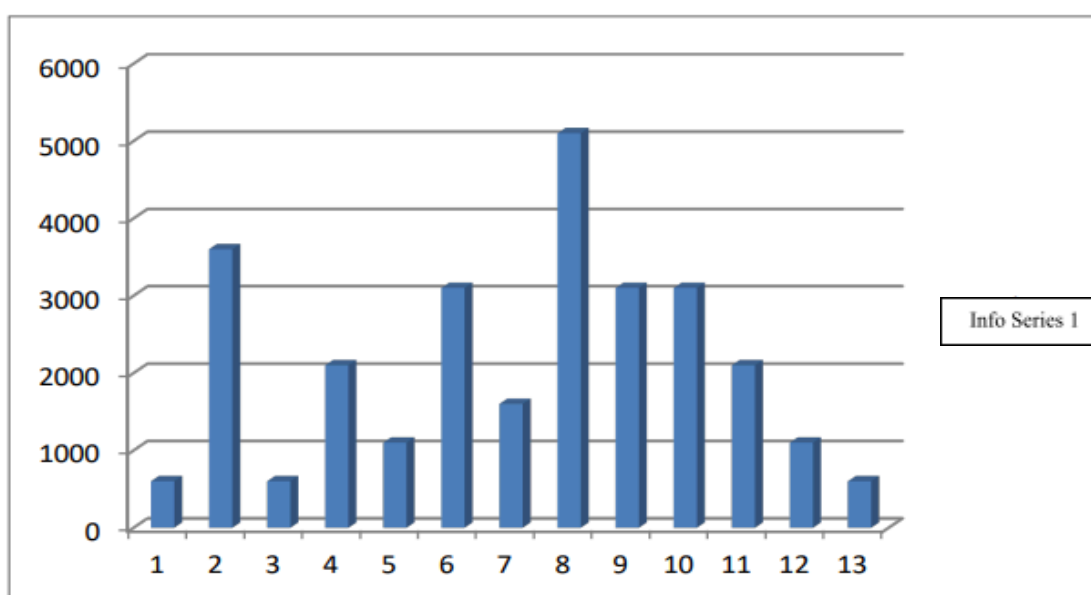

In-text Citation

In-text citation system, APA style, is used in this manuscript systemized by authors last name(s), year of publication, and page numbers of the paper at before or after of the cited text as follows:

1. As the name author–date system implies, the in-text citation includes the author and date with the author names in running text and year of publication in parentheses. For instance:

Research by **Chester L, (1938: 50)** supported...

2. As the name author–date system implies, the in-text citation includes the author and year of publication inside parentheses. For instance:

2.1 In case the author has only one cited author, it must be **(Borel, 2016: 92)**.

2.2 In case the author has two cited authors, it must be used an ampersand (&) between names for a work with two authors: **(Grazer and Fishman, 2015: 12)**.

2.3 In case the author has 3 or more cited authors, it must be used an ampersand (&) before the last author: **(Argyris et al.,1972: 9)**.

At the end of the pieces of the article, you, as the author, need a list of materials that you have used or referred to followed by APA style as follows:

3. Dissertation/Thesis/Thematic Paper/Research Report
