
Who's organizing this?

 <u>Movement</u>, Jesuits USA East, and has been joined and sustained by a growing group
 Sisters of St. Joseph, Brentwood NY Congregation, Congregation of the Sisters of St.
 Joseph of Peace, <u>Christian Life Community</u>, WaterSpirit, Boston Common Asset
 Management, MGR Foundation, Global Impact Investing Network, Porticus, and others.
- Our aim is to collaborate with others to host encounters & gatherings for people to hear Sr. Laura's story directly and from the Karipuna indigenous about the denouncement

they are making at the United Nations and in Brasilia about the disconnect between what Brazil says they are doing and the reality of what's happening in the Amazon rainforest.

Who are the Karipuna?

- <u>Documentary (12 min) about the **Karipuna** Indigenous people Sr. Laura has been accompanying for the past 8 years.</u>
- When we recognize indigenous communities, legally, with rights, they are much more able to protect their land.
- As this satellite image shows, when they are given land recognition, deforestation is dramatically reduced in their territories.



 The solid green from this satellite image of google maps – shows how everything around has been deforested. Sr. Laura and the Karipuna have recently experienced a dramatic increase in the invasions of loggers onto their land. The challenge is there is little recourse given the current situation in Brazil. That's why they're looking for help from the international community.
