Sexual Health Volunteering with Crescent Care

Volunteers will be trained in public health, sexual health, and outreach and education. They will have the opportunity to participate in the creation of a sexual health website geared toward young people in the New Orleans Metropolitan Statistical Area. They will conduct outreach and education side-by-side with CrescentCare Prevention Staff and will help design and implement programs focused on STI prevention, testing, and treatment. If a volunteer goes through the training program, they must devote **at least 10 hours a month** to their service with Crescent Care. Some work may be done remotely.
