#### **Swimming**


In Term 3 we'll be swimming each Friday at Little Makos. We'll give you more information in Term 3.

#### **Discovery Learning**


Next week is also the last for this term 2 discovery learning. Keep an eye out for their fantastic creations and presentations.

#### **Earthquake Drill**


We were delighted with the skills and calmness during our earthquake practice. Ask the children to demonstrate to you what they should be doing.

Our whole school will be participating in a Moveathon Fun Run on 30 June. This will be for everyone. More details next term!




