

Novel Study - Term Two

Due: Thursday of Week 5 (or before by prior arrangement)

Format: On A4 paper, either by hand or printed via Google Docs or a DLO (Digital Learning Object).

<u>End Presentation:</u> A google slide with all work shared (one page for each activity). You can do this using photos, videos, links, DLO's screencastify ... It will be posted on your blog and presented to class.

Compulsory Activities - Do all of these:

- Create a new cover for your novel. This must contain a title, author, blurb and have graphic impact.
- 2) Complete a story web for your novel. Check the class wall display to make sure that you have all of the sections that you need!
- 3) A good novel contains a <u>conflict</u> or a <u>problem</u> central to the plot. Explain 2 conflicts within your novel. Remember to make your answers <u>clear and give examples</u>.
- 4) Characters always change and develop along with the story. Explain how a character has changed within your novel. Again, remember to make your answers **clear and give examples**.
- 5) To complete this project, you will have to utilise lots of HERO values and display a 'Growth Mindset'. Explain the values / attributes that you have used throughout this unit.

Elective Activities - Choose two of these:

- 1) Create an artwork that represents a theme in your novel.
- 2) Create a diorama that reflects the climax of your story. Don't forget to include the title and author.
- 3) Create a meme using a powerful quote from your story and an image of a famous or popular figure. Be witty, not weak!
- 4) Create a board game that takes the player through the events in your novel. Make it fun to play AND attractive. Make sure that you test it to make sure that it works!
- 5) Write a review of your novel. What did you like, and why? What didn't you like, and why? Who would you recommend it to? Why? Give it a rating.
 - Do the compulsory activities first!
 - You will need to read every night at home, and every day at school.
 - Work smart: Google your book title, followed by 'Shmoop'. You will find lots of information about your story in there.
 - As you read, put bookmarks in when you come across important quotes or action. That will save time later on!
