Curtain String Light

Installing [string lights](#) on your curtain is a fun and easy way to add holiday spirit to your home. It's also a great way to get in the holiday spirit if you're decorating last minute.

First, measure the length of your curtains and make sure you have enough cord to attach all of the lights at various lengths. If using multiple strings, try varying their lengths by adding some shorter strands between longer ones, so they don't look too uniform. Then choose which color bulbs (or colored bulbs) will work best for the room you'll be putting them in—not every shade works in every space! Finally, decide whether you want plain strings or wrapped-around swags; swags give more volume but are harder to install than plain strings with hooks attached at each end.
