Based on learner variability, instruction for ELs in oral language knowledge, skills, and abilities must be explicit, intensive, and extensive. There may be a need to emphasize the foundational literacy skills: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and text comprehension, to be successful in reading English.

ELs must develop proficiency in listening and speaking skills in English that cover the depth and breadth of both social and academic vocabulary, as well as grammatical structures.

<u>Curriculum for Secondary ELD Teachers</u>

When?

Designated ELD is a protected time during the regular school day when teachers use the ELD Standards as the focal standards in ways that build into and from content instruction to develop critical:

- English language skills
- Knowledge of language development
- Abilities needed for content learning in English
- Discourse and oral language
- Grammatical structures
- Vocabulary necessary for successful participation in academic tasks in all content areas
- Collaborative discussions

Designated ELD is not a time to teach (or reteach) content. (ELA/ELD Framework, Ch. 2)
