The manuscript must be written in type Times New Roman font with a font size of 12 pt spaced One spaces , and in one format column (except part article title , author's name , and abstract). The distance between the column is 1 cm apart .

Words or terms foreigners use italics . It is better avoid use term foreign for Indonesian language articles . New paragraphs start 1.15 cm from the left margin, while between paragraphs are not given space between .

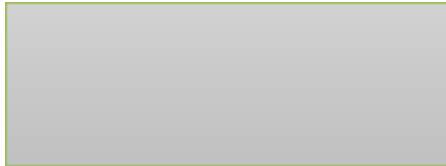


Figure 1. Display Mendeley Standards
