Dear parents/guardians,

My name is Angie Khadijah. I'm thrilled to be working with Achievement First Brooklyn High School this year and to support your students as they put into practice the values of speech and debate. I joined the Brooklyn Debate League as a coach and tournament judge five years ago as an undergraduate studying philosophy at Barnard College. Back in high school, I was a state champion in Senate Congress and went on to compete at (and win) national and state level tournaments almost every weekend. Debate is my passion - I truly believe that having a voice is an invaluable blessing, and that using it for good is an obligation.

In 2017, the Brooklyn Debate League ("BDL"), a nonprofit organization that offers support to public schools trying to build Speech & Debate teams, was built by my amazing mentor K.M. DiColandrea. The Achievement First debate team, previously led by 'DiCo', has been featured on Fox5 News, on MSNBC, in the New York Daily News, in Time Magazine, and more. The BDL has since gone to build debate programs to new schools across New York City, which allowed students to travel to UPenn, a national championship tournament in Kentucky, and more than a dozen competitions across New York City. Our alumni have attended top schools including Yale, Stanford, Princeton, Johns Hopkins and Columbia.

As a BDL staff member, I will be coaching at Achievement First to help build the congressional debate program. We can't wait to see what amazing accolades your student adds to the accolades of the alumni above.

I will be working alongside Achievement First's Speech & Debate coach, Papo Morales. Coach Morales is currently the AP Literature/ELA IV teacher and AF Brooklyn High School Alum from the Class of 2017. During his time at AFBHS, Coach Morales was one of the Founders of the Speech team in 2014. While he was on the team, he served as the Speech Captain for three years. Coach Morales is beyond excited to rejoin the team as a coach and is ready to build a nationally ranked team!

Achievement First Brooklyn High School's debate partnership with the BDL is a year long program that includes:

- Weekly congressional debate lessons with Coach Angie from 2:45-4:45 on Tuesdays
- After-school practice with Coach Morales on Thursdays from 2:45 - 3:45
- Online scrimmages from 5:45-8pm on: 10/19, 11/2, 11/16, 11/30, 12/14, 1/18, 2/1, 2/15, 2/29, 3/14, and 3/28.
- Optional online Brooklyn Debate League practices every other Thursday (when there isn't a scrimmage) from 5:30-7pm
