Grades: 6th-12th

Creating an Inciting Incident

Common Core Standard: CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.W.3A

Materials Needed: Paper and Pencil or a Chromebook/Laptop

Objective: Students will be able to create a story conflict with an inciting incident.

Lesson Plan

- 1. Watch Tricia Levenseller's class on Inciting Incidents. You could pause the class at 23:30, because this is when the question and answer portion of the class begins.
- 2. Remind students that before they can create a story conflict or an inciting incident, they must know the answer to these questions:
- What does your main character want?
- What is the main conflict of your story?
- How will you involve your main character in the main conflict?
- At what point will your character choose involvement in the conflict?
- 3. Tell students that they are going to get a chance to craft some inciting incidents today. First have them get out a sheet of paper or their laptop. Have them write the answers to the questions you just went over. Then go back to minute 9:15 of the video and project the equation on the sheet below on the board. Do the activity Tricia had the teens in the class do giving more time if needed.
- 4. Have students share some of the inciting incidents they wrote.
- 5. Summarize by reminding students that all good stories include a conflict and an inciting incident. Have them go into stories they've already written and see if they can find the inciting incidents in those stories.
