Cites in the abstract should be avoided, but if you have to do so because it is necessary, write the author's name and year.

Keywords: Maximum 5 keywords. Avoid plural words and words that contain a variety of meanings.

INTRODUCTION, contains explanations about research problems, research objectives.; single-spaced; uses a 12 pt Times New Roman, space 1

LITERATURE REVIEW OR THEORITICAL BACKGROUND, Literature review: review all kinds of literature that related to the problem of the study. Theoretical background: summary of theoretical studies related to the problem or research question; single-spaced; uses a 12 pt Times New Roman, space 1

At least thirty references are required, with journal publications accounting for 80% of the total. Secondary citations should not be used in references. Up to 15% of the total references may be self-cited


