Surrey United Way of Play

All teams and coaches are expected to follow the SUSC “way of play”. The playing philosophy is designed to be a progression of aligned steps that a player will follow as they move up age groups and up or down levels of play in their development path. It is designed to provide consistency and a continuum for a youth soccer player to learn the game and for a developing and evolving team to build on important aspects of general game understanding, teamwork, and general and individual fun in the sport.

Surrey United Player Development Philosophy

SUSC’s development pathway aligns with the Canadian Soccer Association’s Long-Term Player Development (LTPD) model while maintaining a development-first philosophy, allowing players to progress through the appropriate stages of the Surrey United Program Outline Model.

Player development is the journey of a player from mini soccer to adult soccer. As Surrey United is a “cradle to grave” club, the focus is on creating a fun environment where players want to continue to come back. Grouping players based on age has been a common tendency in the past; however, trends and benchmarks will still be used to evaluate players individually, giving players opportunities to be challenged within different team and academy environments.

Surrey United Soccer Club is committed to the long-term development of each of our players. Not every player will develop their mental, technical and physical abilities at the same time. Our responsibility is to make sure that our players are in the appropriate playing environment to reach their full potential. As a result, we offer many different training and playing options to allow for player growth over the longer term. As construction progresses, we ask all members to follow posted signage and respect all construction-related instructions throughout the season. While we don't expect any direct impact to sessions or games, please be aware that parking disruptions may occur, particularly during major delivery periods (e.g., steel and turf installation) in the area between CAP #2 and CAP #3.

Volunteering on Team Staff

We love our volunteer coaches, assistant coaches and managers. We need these individuals to deliver our programming and develop our athletes. To keep our players safe, we must have all team staff names on file together with a criminal record check, respect in sport certification and registration details required by BC Soccer. **NO ADULT MAY BE ON THE FIELD / BENCH WITH THE TEAM WITHOUT THESE IN PLACE.** Contact riskmanagement@surreyunitedsoccer.com with any questions, and your age group registrar to be added to any team staff record, regardless of participation level. Whether it be a game or practice here or there, adults on the bench with the players must have these in place. All team staff must be registered with BC Soccer through our Registrar team.

How Scheduling Works

Our club works directly with the city of Surrey on field allocations. We are designated field space with permits based on our number of participants.

As our club is based in Cloverdale, most of our field allocations will be at Cloverdale Athletic Park (CAP), however in the fall and spring, we share space with other sports such as football, ultimate, etc. and are required to use other fields, specifically Hjorth Road (Guildford) and Newton Athletic Park. This is entirely based on City of Surrey allocations and while we continue to work with the City for additional, local field additions, we do our best to work with what we are provided.

When field conditions are good in the spring and early fall we will often use grass fields at schools in the Cloverdale community. As daylight changes in late September, we will begin to rely on lights and training locations may change around Thanksgiving. This is when we begin to also use gravel allocations because there simply is not enough turf space under the lights at Cloverdale / Hjorth. U6 and U7 teams move into local school gyms for their weeknight practices after Thanksgiving.

Scheduling is a complex process, we have over 225 teams and do our best to ensure younger teams are placed earlier in the evenings whenever possible. While this is not always possible, we do work hard to accommodate all of our members and this will become easier in 2025-26 with the planned addition of two more turf fields and a covered turf field facility at Cloverdale Athletic Park, which will keep more of our members close to home.

Practices/Games

Practice schedule and weekend game time slots are assigned based on days, times, and partnering teams/age groups. ***The Spring Season runs from April to the end of June. The Fall season runs from the beginning of September to the beginning of March.*** We usually start training at the end of August or after labour day depending on the age group.

Weather-related cancellations (air quality, snow) are communicated to the coaches and managers and posted on our social media channels before 2pm on the impacted day and messages will be sent from your coach/manager. Please do not contact the club for this information independently, you will be notified.

Game Schedules

Game schedules are made available to coaches as far in advance as possible. For the youngest ages, this is fairly static (U6/U7) however for older ages that play within a league, the league dictates when SUSC teams play at home and when they play away. Away teams have their own way of scheduling and their own field allocations to work within.

GAME SCHEDULES ARE AVAILABLE EVERY MONDAY NIGHT. These usually remain unchanged. HOWEVER, the City of Surrey, due to weather or other complications, may close fields that are not suitable for play. This happens before Thursday of each week and when this happens, we have to adjust games accordingly and try to maintain our original schedule as best as possible, but sometimes games will change for this reason. We update the schedule with these changes on Thursday nights, if any occur.

NOTE: High performance leagues have mandatory game requirements that must take priority from time to time. These are out of our control as they are governed by Canada Soccer and not by Surrey United.
