This article states that this process can take 3 to 6 months to complete with multiple home visits required. I believe that this process should now include 2 home visits to ensure the house is a safe living place for the child during the first visit background check will be started with fingerprints, personal references should be provided, and income statements. Then, between the first and second visit this data can be processed and reviewed than by the second visit there can once again be an evaluation of the living conditions and any changes made. During these visits, if the family provides what they are looking for as an addition to the family, it will make the matching process easier as well since then the adoption center can start finding possible options before this process is completed once the family finishes the check they can than move straight to the decision process.

 - Doctors may test embryos at a mother's request
 - Both parents must consent to the use of CRISPR on the embryo
 - If the biological father is not in the picture because the mother was impregnated during a criminal act, only her consent is needed
 - If the mother is under the age of 18
 - Whether parental consent is required would follow a states abortion policy
- The technology could also be used for agricultural purposes since it could provide the same benefits to farm life
 - Editing would still be restricted to diseases or health conditions with genetic markers
- Mandate insurance companies to cover the expense of genetic editing, but to avoid skyrocketing health insurance costs they would not be forced to pay for the testing, that would be on the parents.
