Here is what an entry should look like:

## What does metacognitive mean?

## What does "Go Meta" mean?

## How does this journal work?

When asked or own your own, you will write a:


- Standards Entry (this is about the expectations of the class and doing history work)
   OR
- b) Content Entry (the history that we are learning about)
- c) Both

At the top of the page, write down if it is a standards or content entry with the date.

Then, reflect on your learning using the "Go Meta" words. Aim to write at least 200 words per entry and consider the following questions:

- 1. How have you changed as a thinker or a learner as a result of something you have learned?
- 2. Where are you seeing growth? Where are you seeing challenges?
- 3. How would a younger version of yourself have responded to this challenge or content? What is different now?
- 4. What content or skills are you still struggling with? Why?
- 5. What are you proud of? Why?
- 6. How did the content challenge you as a person? As a learner?

This is your chance to show me your reflection skills and tell me about moments I have missed. This can help me see if you understand the content or the new skills. You will NOT be penalized for incorrect information here but I may use this information to clarify points with you.
