Are you tired of fumbling with SD cards, scraping images, and what about all those settings? 🙄 **Trombone womp**

I'm still excited to present my Miyoo Mini pack, Done Set 3.

Inspired by all the great packs out there, I wanted to give to the community my meticulously packed directories for Onion OS. Are you ready for some choice paralysis?

- Main Features

-  119 gb with box art and manuals. 174 gb with the PS1 addon. Auto extractor for Windows to make your choices.
-  The most popular systems (29 total). Pre-configured ports and console addons like Fami Disk System, Sega CD, Turbografx-CD and Satellaview. Odd handheld systems like Lynx and Game & Watch games. Many great homebrew and hacks.
-  Three different box art options from ScreenScraper.
-  Game manuals in PDF format, accessed directly from the GLO menu (*Y button*) while browsing game lists.
-  Configs for the best aspect ratio, filters, overlays, performance and options.
-  An Emu folder with a sensible arrangement of consoles for better viewing accommodations.
-  Cheats! [Please watch this public service announcement](#)
-  A ridiculous BIOS folder. You'll be prepared to add any system.
-  And more!

- Updates and Frequently Asked Questions



Here's all the little problems found after uploading Done Set 3. *The irony!*

1. **There are copies of NES manuals-** Inside of Manuals.zip, there are unnecessary copies of NES manuals which add up to over 2gb. WHOOPS! Delete the folders inside of `\Roms\FC\Manuals` to get rid of them.

2. **After installing Done Set 3, the problems below can be fixed all at once by going [here](#)**, choosing what model you have, downloading and then extracting the zip file to the root of your SD card, choosing to overwrite all.
 - a. **In the config files, the performance option for DOS is set to max. Also, the Wolfenstein configs need to be changed to work with the beta version of Onion OS-** It seems that in most games, DOS performance is better if the setting is set back to the default of auto. Also, for the Wolfenstein port, auto save state loading should be disabled to work better with the new game switcher. (plus some of the core options weren't optimal)
 - b. **I've redone the arcade configs so that each game will use its correct aspect ratio-** This will remedy games that look squished. With that, I've added a CRT overlay for the 4:3 games.
 - c. **Dino Crisis for PS1 seems to be the European version with copyright protection.**
3. **Commodore, ZX Spectrum, and DOS games may require setting a different controller type in the RetroArch settings-** I could go through, configure controls for each, get Vectrex backgrounds for each game, it would take for freaking ever and I'm sorry. They're there, but I don't have experience with the original consoles to put all of the games in proper working order. I tried to set the default controls to be the most configured or most likely to work for those systems.

FAQ-

Q- What does this have that Tiny Best Set doesn't?

A- Tiny Best Set has a curated list of games for various sized SD cards with options for box art. I've encountered a couple of problems with Tiny Best Set. It uses PAL region NES games which end up playing at the wrong speed and faulty .m3u files and directories for PSX multi disc games, which then can't be read correctly by retroarch. Little things like having the rom suffixes on every game, having gamelist.xml for every game folder, stuff like that. Tiny set has some variance in the PS1 game selection.

Done Set 3 has more systems and games. Each system has a curated list of the best games and sub folders to include the rest of the games, hacks, translated ports, etc. It has things preconfigured to give the user a polished look and options. Included are many old instruction books for the games in PDF format, which can easily be viewed from the GLO menu. (Y button while browsing a list of games) Done Set doesn't use gamelist XML files to allow users an easier experience when adding or moving games (except in the Arcade and NeoGeo section).

Q- Why has Done Set 2 and 3 removed systems like Super GameBoy, Wonderswan and Neo Geo Pocket?

A- There's a quirk to the Main UI, which Onion OS is forced to use. I've removed these systems to keep the menu tidy, especially when the search function is used. Not having an extra space at the end of consoles would cause strange behavior when scrolling through. I would have to add them back plus 5 more consoles to get a proper menu. Look at it this way, if you want more consoles to choose from, then I've saved some of the fun for you.

Q- Will this work with other devices or front-ends?

A- The bios files and game files themselves should work with anything, but the folder names and structure of them almost certainly need changes to work with anything else. Check the documentation for your device and emulators. Maybe it prefers games to be unzipped, box art in different folders, etc. Arcade games might not work elsewhere. It depends on the MAME romset the emulator calls for.

Q- Can I swap my SD card between a Plus and a Mini v4?

A- Onion OS has ways to tell what you're using and accommodates switching SD cards. If I were to choose on what model the overlays look best and what configs to use, I would choose v4. If you play on the Plus more, it would probably be worth putting the plus configs on the SD instead.

Q- Can I update Onion OS down the road, no problem?

A- I hope! The goal of Done Set 3 is to avoid any future conflicts with updating. I've never had a problem (except that time I put a custom retroarch.cfg in the set, which was every time except this one). I always update using the OTA Updater, just for fun.

Q- Can I use netplay even though the game names might differ from other people's games?

A- RetroArch netplay checks for the hash tag assigned to each game file and doesn't care about the file name. I've tested this with someone, making sure we used the same Onion OS emulator core and it went as well as I could expect.

Q- Can I scrape my own box art and have it match the rest?

A- You can! If you plan on adding new games and would like to scrape matching box art, you can match the smooth look using [these templates](#) with the windows program, [Skraper](#). The full height mix can be found [here](#).

Q- I've installed the configs and overlays, but I don't like the grainy look of the games. Can I easily disable the CRT look/grid/borders?

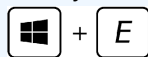
A- You can download the configs for disabled overlays from [here](#). Choose which Miyoo Mini device you have, download and extract to the root of your SD card, overwriting all.

For the Super Noobs:

If you're a Windows user, included is an Auto Setup.bat file, which will guide you and automate the extraction process.

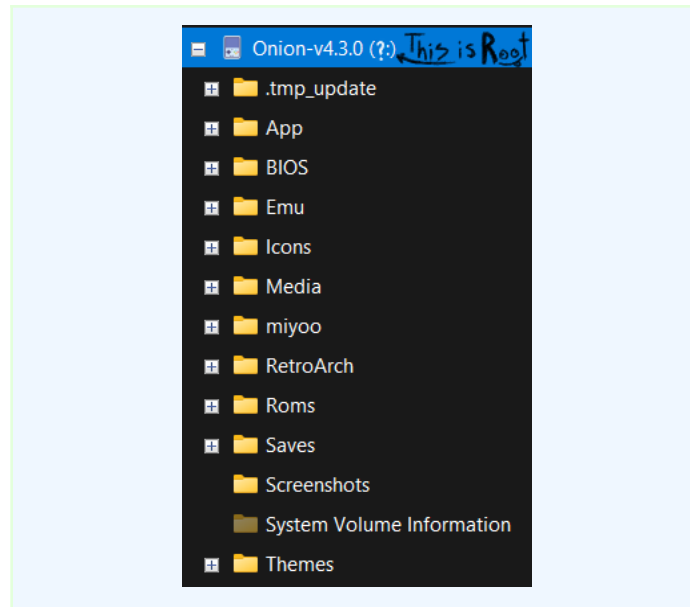
If you're installing manually, make sure you're not simply moving or copying the .zip files. You're wanting to **extract** the folders within the .zip files to the root of the SD card.

To open File Explorer, you can use the hotkey

The PS1 Addon by Alexlumper has been added. A chunk of games has been put into a separate installation module to accommodate either 128gb or 256gb SD cards.

I've added a few games here and there.

I think the set is FINALLY looking good now. **I only wanted to make a Done Set 3 to fix the issues with the last one and to help prevent conflicts with future updates.**

- About the Miyoo Mini

- The SD cards shipped with Miyoo Minis are prone to failure. It's highly recommended to replace the micro SD card with a brand that you know is legitimate.
- Your device may have outdated firmware, but it's not likely if bought new and ordered from the official store. Be careful and only update firmware if you have to. To check and update it, [follow the official instructions](#).
- The most recent models of the Miyoo Mini (v4 and + models) can support charging with USB-C to USB-C cables and can use various power adapters (although some cables might not be accepted by the device). Miyoo Mini V1, V2 and V3 need a USB A to USB C cable to charge the battery and a 5 volt 1 amp adapter if you want to charge from a wall outlet. Any deviation from this has been known to damage the hardware.

- About Done Set 3



Use the torrent download option for a faster download - Use whichever torrent program works for you, but if you're looking for recommendations: on Windows, **qBittorrent** is king, and on Mac, they like to use **Transmission**.

→ **If you have a VPN, San Francisco will give you faster speeds.**

- You don't have to download everything if you don't want to, such as the PS1 addon
- **This is meant for a fresh installation** - The file name formatting for games in Done Set 3 have regions removed (ie. these games do not have (USA) or (Japan) next to a game title). Attempting to add Done Set 3 on top of a game set that does have regions in titles (like Tiny Best Set) would result in two separate game files of the same game on your Miyoo Mini. It is unlikely you would have enough space to add both. Even with Done Set 1 or 2, this would produce unwanted duplicates.
- **Are you planning to use personal saves from previous emulators, devices or game**

libraries? - When you transfer saves, you will need to match and change the file name of the save to its corresponding game. If you were playing a game that used regions in the filename, you will need to manually remove the regions to each save file before you transfer it over. You can also use a tool like "Bulk Rename Utility".

If you are transferring saves from another Onion OS install, be careful:

- Because the **configs subfolder** is in **\Saves\CurrentProfile\config**, you need to avoid overwriting the new, Done Set 3 configs with your old ones.
- Just make sure to overwrite the old config folder with the new one in Done Set 3, or delete the config folder from both **\Saves\CurrentProfile** and **\Saves\GuestProfile** from your old backup before copying it to the SD card.

- You may need to install a program to format your SD card (Rufus is recommended by Onion OS).
- **You must install Onion OS before transferring Done Set to get the proper setup.**

- Insert your SD card into your PC.
- Erase and format the SD Card by following [these instructions](#).



Step 2: Adding and Installing Onion OS to Your SD Card

- Add Onion OS to your SD Card by following the [instructions listed here](#).
- Eject your SD Card safely from your computer.
- Insert your SD card into your Miyoo Mini and power on the handheld.
- Allow the OS to install and then follow the instructions on the screen to get to the *Package Manager*.

- Press the “Start” button twice to confirm your decisions and your Miyoo Mini will shut down (Miyoo Mini + will restart).



Step 3: Download and Install Done Set 3

- After downloading the set using the torrent option, you should see a folder named, “done-set-three_202501” in your download directory. Inside of it are the installation modules in zip format and the *Auto Setup.bat*.

- Insert your SD card back into your Windows PC and ignore the error message.
 - Double click the *Auto Setup.bat*. The latest version of the auto installer will be downloaded into the directory and start.
 - Follow the prompts. Select your SD card and click “OK” to set the extraction location, choose what you want, confirm your choices, then the extraction process will begin. You’ll see the progress of each extraction and be notified when it’s all complete.



Note: The extraction process will take some time and don’t be fooled if it slows down; it’s loading tens of thousands of files. If the transfer time expectation is large, that’s just because of the many small files. The transfer time will speed up after it gets through the small files.



Optional Box Art Examples

If you want images, you have three options:



- Box art [*Imgs (2D Box).zip*]

- A mix of box art and screenshots [*imgs (2D Box and Screenshot).zip*]
- and the default for Miyoo, a screenshot and game title, sized to fit perfectly [*imgs (Miyoo Mix).zip*]

If you plan on adding new games and would like to scrape matching box art, you can match the smooth look using [these templates](#) with the windows program, [Skraper](#). The full height mix can be found [here](#).

 If, for some reason, this process needs to be done manually, I recommend using [7zip](#) and following the next sequence of instructions.

- Insert your SD card back into your Windows PC and extract Done Set 3.zip directly to the root of the SD card. The simplest way that I do this is...
 - Open File Explorer.
 - Navigate to where Done Set 3.zip was downloaded.
 - Double click *Done Set 3.zip*.
 - Once 7zip opens, click the option to extract.
 - Choose the root of your SD card and click "OK".
 - You will want to select "merge and overwrite" when asked.
- Repeat the process for any extras that you want to have.
 - If you choose to manually install the cheats, you will have to manually enable the cheats menu by changing a line of code in the *retroarch.cfg* file. Follow [these instructions, starting with #4](#).



Step 4: Refresh Game Cache

- Safely remove your SD card from your computer, insert your SD card into your Miyoo Mini.
- Once you're powered on and at the main menu, tap the "Select" button and hit "Refresh". If games are moved, added or deleted at any point in the future, you must refresh your game cache in order for the Search function to work effectively.

Important:

- You do not need to install any programs to do this; for the reformatting in the next steps, you can use the native Disk Utility application (*Applications -> Utilities -> Disk Utility*).

Step 3: Unzipping and Add Done Set 3 to Your SD Card

- After downloading *Done Set 3.zip*, you can use Mac’s native unzipping tool to unzip your files by double clicking.
- You can find your SD card nested in your *Finder sidebar*. Click and drag the folder onto your SD card, then release and choose the option to *merge*.
- Repeat this for any extras that you want to have.
 - If you choose to have the cheats, you will have to manually enable the cheats menu by changing a line of code in the *retroarch.cfg* file. Follow [these instructions, starting with #4](#).

- The Games and Systems

Systems have all US, Euro exclusive, popular hacks, popular Japanese translations and an assortment of home brew and unlicensed games.

(a few systems don't have ALL of the games because it would be insane. Trust me.)

The best games are in the main folder for each system and there's no top-this-number of games.



The rest are placed into the "**All But the Best**" subfolder, but a few are so bad, they're good, and are the rare exceptions. Try to guess which ones. I think you'll be pleasantly surprised.

If you think a game deserves to be moved in or out, it's as easy as moving the game in *Onion's file explorer app* (enabled from the *Package Manager*) and refreshing the game list. Other subfolders are included for the various other games.

- Systems with fewer games don't necessitate subfolders.
- I've removed the file name decorations, (USA), (Euro), etc, except when they're helpful.
- This game set aims to be the most complete for the Miyoo device, while still trimming things down to exclude non-working and non-English language games, and to keep it on a reasonable size SD card. I also didn't want to include too many configuration changes and extra features, like using experimental cores or overclocking. I want the user to have some choice in how their device works, and to take agency in the extra features, niche systems and expert configurations.

Here's the optional but sensible arrangement of consoles



Here's an explanation for each system and the notable changes when using the included config files.

Following the name of each system is their respective folder used in Onion OS.

Nintendo Entertainment System – FC

Default Core: **lr-fceumm**

- I did the curating. My first console.
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes

Super Nintendo Entertainment System – SFC

Default Core: **lr-mednafen-supafaust**

- I also did the curating.
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes except for Mario RPG and Kirby Super Star. I had to manually add a line to prevent the core or content directory override from enabling rewind. It's possible I didn't find all of the games that have slow down or audio popping when rewind is enabled.
 - Sometimes a homebrew or hacked game will require a different core to run properly, like Snes9x 2005 plus.

GameBoy – GB

Default Core: **lr-gambatte**

- I disabled the palette changing hotkeys
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes

GameBoy Color – GBC

Default Core: **lr-gambatte**

- I disabled the palette changing hotkeys
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes

GameBoy Advance – GBA

Default Core: **lr-gpsp**

- Huge thanks to Axcelon for their expertise in GBA. You can thank them for a great list of GBA games. (and Kirby 2 DX on GBC)
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: No

Nintendo DS - NDS

Default Core: **Drastic**

- [uhhhhhhhhhhhh here ya go](#)

PlayStation – PS

Default Core: lr-pcsx-rearmed

- Save States: Yes, but sometimes slow to save
- Rewind Enabled: No

Arcade – ARCADE

Default Core: lr-mame2003plus

- Curation done by EBZero
- Press select to add coins
- Some games may take a little time to load.
- To exit arcade games, it's best to use hotkey+select to bring up the RetroArch Quick Menu. Press B to go back to the RetroArch Main Menu, then go down to Quit RetroArch. (Fixed in 4.4.0 beta)
- Enter the arcade's diagnostic menu by going to the RetroArch Quick Menu - core options - system, then toggle "Display MAME menu". You can toggle this back off when you're done.
- The names for MAME and Final Burn Alpha are created by miyoogamelist.xml, which is in the folder along with the games. This goes for CPS3 and Neo Geo as well. If you want to add arcade games and box art, you have to add them to the .xml file, or delete the file and live with the shortened game names.
 - Save States: Yes and No. Auto saving is enabled and auto loading is disabled. After your game is fully loaded, use the hotkey + left to select the auto save state slot. This will load the last auto save.
 - Rewind Enabled: No

Capcom Play System 3 – CPS3

Default Core: fbalpha2012_cps3_libretro

- Press select to add coins
- Hold select to bring up the arcade diagnostic menu to change options for the game, like difficulty. If the menu is in Japanese, the bottom option usually takes you back to the game.
- Don't worry, these games take a while to load, but they are so worth it. Stand by for Street Fighter III: Third Strike!
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: No

Sega Master System – MS

Default Core: lr-picodrive

- Save States: Yes
- Rewind Enabled: Yes, but I've found it to be buggy.

- Pressing L2 changes controller type. Might screw with the controls for some games or make them better. Usually it just makes the game unplayable.

TurboGrafx-CD - PCECD

Default Core: **lr-mednafen-pce-fast**

- Pressing L2 changes controller type. Might screw with the controls for some games or make them better. Usually it just makes the game unplayable.
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes

Neo Geo – NEOGEO

Default Core: `lr_fbalpha2012_neogeo`

- Press select to add coins
- Some games may take some time to load
- Hold select to bring up the diagnostic menu to change options for the game like difficulty.
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: No

ColecoVision – COLECO

Default Core: `lr-bluemsx`

- Game Switcher can be kinda laggy or just not work, sometimes. (Fixed in 4.4.0 beta)
 - Save States: Yes, but they can be iffy. I'm pretty sure the thing was originally running off cassette tapes.
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes

Commodore 64 – COMMODORE

Default Core: `lr-vice_x64`

- Select brings up the graphic keyboard
- Game Switcher might not work properly. Use the RetroArch Menu to quit. (Fixed in 4.4.0 beta)
 - Save States: Yes, but also iffy
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes

ZX Spectrum – ZXS

Default Core: `lr-fuse`

- Select brings up the graphic keyboard
- Game Switcher might not work properly. Use the RetroArch Menu to quit. (Fixed in 4.4.0 beta)
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes

Vectrex – VECTREX

Default Core: `lr-vecx`

- These games are hard to configure and maintain proper frame rate to emulate original hardware, especially on a mini. Expect it to flicker. Maybe someone else could do a better job.
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: No. It looks too wild

Famicom Disk System – FDS

Default Core: **lr-fceumm**

- Japanese addon for the Famicom.
- R button Ejects disk, L button flips disk, R button to reinsert disk
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: Yes

Satellaview – SATELLAVIEW

Default Core: **lr-snes9x**

- Also known as BS (broadcast satellite). These SNES games were live streamed to Japan in the 90s. No, really.
- Games were delivered usually on a weekly basis, so we have many games that look the same, but these are the weekly installments they put out. There's an in-game clock corresponding to play time. Because the game was broadcast, players could only play for the duration of the broadcast. These games should start up just fine but the in-game clock will be at 00:00. Players would have to wait 7 minutes for the game to start for everyone to get in and get ready to play. Some games don't have this limitation but some still do.
- Many of these games had audio tracks that went along with the gameplay, but they're lost to time. These games have a (soundlink) decoration in their names. They may not have background music but they're playable.
- Some people have made hacks to restore some of these games to be readily playable. I've put BS Zelda: third quest in the translated section of SNES.
- After you start a game the BS bios will load. You're presented with a menu to pick a name and profile. After that you're booted to the BS town hub, AKA The Town Whose Name Was Stolen. Feel free to explore but the only way to play anything is to turn straight around and go back into the house you came out of. Continue through the menu, choosing the first option, and the game will begin to load.
 - Save States: Yes and no. Auto saving is on but auto loading is off. You have to wait until the game files are completely loaded before loading a save state.
 - Rewind Enabled: No

Game & Watch – GW

Default Core: **lr-gw**

- Save States: No
- Rewind Enabled: No

Pico8 – PICO

Default Core: **fake-08**

- Save States: Yes and No. Auto save is on, Auto load is off.
- Rewind Enabled: No

MS-DOS – DOS

Default Core: **lr-dosbox_pure**

- You might have to change the controller type in RetroArch, or other types of fiddling.
 - Save States: Yes
 - Rewind Enabled: No

ScummVM – SCUMMVM

- These are PC, point and click adventure games.
- ScummVM is not as straightforward as the other emulators. There's an option at the bottom of the game list to import games to ScummVM from the \Roms\SCUMMVM folder. This is used if you want to add new games.
- (note) - some of the earlier SCUMMVM games don't like the native core. Try the standalone version from the expert tab of the Package Manager, enable the expert menu and install the games from there.
 - Save States: No. **Use the Start button to open the ScummVM menu and save from there, or use the in game save functions.**
 - Rewind Enabled: No
