DOCUMENTS:

The application and enrollment documents (listed below) for admission to the master and doctorate programs, must be digitalized (scanned) from the original version, front and back, saved as electronic files in "pdf" format, and sent to the email international@unoesc.edu.br

Required documents:

1. Identity card (RG) or, in the case of foreigners, a National Migratory Registry Card - CRNM, Foreigners Identity Card – CIE, or Passport;
- 2.1. For application to the master's course: A diploma from the undergraduate course, in accordance with the legislation in force (see below);

The diploma, or the proof of course completion, issued by foreign institutions, must be accompanied by a sworn translation and, when coming from a signatory country of the Hague Convention, it must contain an apostille, and when from countries that are not States Parties to the Hague Apostille Convention, it must contain the consular legalization obtained from the Consular Offices of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MRE) abroad. For admission to courses that add professional attribution, the candidate who took his/her undergraduate studies abroad must present the revalidated diploma and the candidate who took a stricto

sensu post-graduate course must present a recognized diploma.

2.2 For application to the Doctorate course: A diploma from the Master's course, in accordance with the legislation in force (see below);

The diploma, or the proof of course completion, issued by foreign institutions, must be accompanied by a sworn translation and, when coming from a signatory country of the Hague Convention, it must contain an apostille, and when from countries that are not States Parties to the Hague Apostille Convention, it must contain the consular legalization obtained from the Consular Offices of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MRE) abroad. For admission to courses that add professional attribution, the candidate who took his/her undergraduate studies abroad must present the revalidated diploma and the candidate who took a stricto sensu post-graduate course must present a recognized diploma.

3. Resume on the Lattes Platform updated by the date of registration (or Curriculum Vitae, if the candidate is a foreigner);
4. Academic memoir and professional trajectory of the candidate;
5. Pre-project of the investigative proposal (script below).

The selected candidate must immediately take the necessary steps to register with the Individual Taxpayer's Registry (CPF), because his/her registration number is necessary to register on the Sucupira Platform, a system that collects information, analyses, and evaluations to be used as a standardizing base for the Brazilian National Post Graduation System.

MEMOIR AND PRE-PROJECT SCRIPT

Model

In dissertative format, with a maximum of five pages, in Times New Roman 12 font and 1.5 line spacing, the memoir must contain and highlight relevant information from the candidate's academic and professional career, constituting a retrospective, analytical, and evaluative account of his/her academic and professional background. It is recommended that the connections between the academic and professional trajectories, and the research to be developed, be pointed out.

Formatting the pre-project

- a) cover page containing: identification of the candidate, title of the project, and intended line of research;
- b) length: except for the cover and references, of at least 8 (eight) and at most 10 (ten) pages.

Script

- Justification;
- Theoretical framework: problematization and object of study;
- Objectives (general and specific);
- Methodology;
- References.

SELECTION PROCESS

The selection process consists of three evaluation stages:

- I. Full delivery of all documents requested in the application, with an eliminatory character.
It will have a weight of 30% in the composition of the final grade;
- II. Evaluation of the curriculum, with a character classification. It will have a weight of 30% in the composition of the final grade;
- III. Interview, having as its objective the pre-draft research and the memoir, with a character classification. It will have the weight of 40% in the composition of the final grade.

To take into account:

- The analysis and discussion of the pre-draft have the objective of evaluating: adherence to the line of research; clarity and precision of the research problem; originality and relevance of the proposed thesis; viability of the thesis based on the methodology and sources of research informed in the pre-draft; quality of the literature review and quality of the specialized foreign and national literature cited in the literature review; global consistency of the pre-draft.
- The curriculum vitae will help the selection committee responsible for analyzing and discussing the pre-project to better understand the candidate's academic and professional profile.
- In the evaluation of the curriculum, zero to ten (10) points will be awarded, considering the following bibliographical productions published from 2018 (inclusive) up to the application deadline:
 - I. article in periodical;
 - II. article in proceedings of national or international events (articles, expanded abstracts, and abstracts in regional or local events will not be awarded points);
 - III. book chapter (printed or digital) published by a commercial or university publishing house with an Editorial Board;
 - IV. single-authored book (printed or digital) published by a commercial or university publishing house with an Editorial Board.
 - V. co-authored book (printed or digital) published by a commercial publisher or university with an Editorial Board (the organization or coordination of collections will not be scored).
