Abstract

The abstract is written in a single paragraph without subheadings, consisting of 150 to 200 words. It must be written in English using an academic, objective, and clear style to comprehensively reflect the substance of the research. The abstract should be formatted in **Times New Roman, size 10 pt, with single spacing (1.0)**. References or citations are not allowed. The abstract should end with a list of **three to five keywords** that are relevant to the content of the research and easily indexed.

The content structure of the abstract includes several main components, namely background, objective, method, findings and implications, and conclusion.

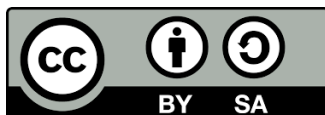
Background: provides a brief overview of the issue or problem underlying the research and its relevance to the field of study.

Objective: is briefly stated to indicate the direction and focus of the research conducted.

Method: describes the approach, design, and techniques of data collection and analysis used in the study.

Findings and Implications: present the main results of the research along with their impact or contribution to the development of knowledge, practice, or policy.

Conclusion: contains the final statement that answers the research objective and, if necessary, provides recommendations or directions for future research.



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INTRODUCTION (12 PT BOLD)

The introduction must contain (in order) general background, previous literature studies (*state of the art*) as the basis for the statement of scientific novelty of the article, statement of scientific novelty, and research problems or hypotheses. At the end of the introduction, the purpose of the study of the article must be written. In the format of a scientific article, there is no literature review as in the research report, but it is manifested in the form of a previous literature review (*state of the art*) followed by a statement of scientific novelty of the article.

Citations should be written using a bodynote format such as (Uwuigbe & Ajibolade, 2013), (Wang, 2016), (Muttakin et al., 2015) and relevant to the Bibliography/Bibliography (recommended using the Mendeley App).

METHOD (12 PT BOLD)

The research methods used in problem solving include the analysis method. The image caption is placed as part of the image title (*figure caption*) instead of being part of the image. The methods used in the completion of the research are written in this section.

In the Research Method, small and non-main tools (common in the lab, such as: scissors, measuring cups, pencils) do not need to be written, but just write down the main set of equipment, or the main tools used for analysis and/or characterization, even need to get to the type and accuracy; Write in full the location of the research, the number of respondents, how to process the results of observations or interviews or questionnaires, how to measure performance benchmarks; methods that are already common do not need to be written in detail, but simply refer to the reference book. The experimental procedure must be written in the form of a news sentence, not a command sentence.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION (12 PT BOLD)

The results and discussion contain the results of the research and its discussion scientifically. Write down the scientific findings obtained from the results of the research that has been carried out but must be supported by adequate data. The scientific findings referred to here are not the data of the research results obtained. The scientific findings must be explained scientifically including: What are the scientific findings obtained? Why does it happen? Why is there such a trend of variables? All of these questions must be explained scientifically, not only descriptively, if necessary supported by adequate basic scientific phenomena. In addition, they must also be explained in comparison with the results of other researchers who are almost on the same topic. The results of the research and findings must be able to answer the research hypothesis in the introduction.

Manuscripts can be written in Indonesian or English with a maximum number of pages of 20 pages including images and tables. Manuscripts must be written according to this article template in a print-ready form (Camera ready). Articles must be written with A4 (210 x 297 mm) writing field sizes and with a left margin format of 3 cm, right margin 3 cm, bottom margin 3 cm, and top margin 3 cm. Manuscripts must be written in Times New Roman typeface with a font size of 12 pt spaced apart, and in a single-column format (except for the article title, author's name, and abstract). The distance between columns is 1 cm.

Foreign words or terms are used in italics. It is best to avoid using foreign terms for Indonesian articles. New paragraphs start 1.15 cm from the left border, while there are no spaces between paragraphs.

Tables and Figures are placed in the text group after the table or image has been referenced. Each image should be given a Figure Caption at the bottom of the image and numbered in order of numbers followed by the title of the image. Each table should be titled Table Caption and numbered in order of numbers at the top of the table followed by the table title. Images should be guaranteed to be clearly printed (font size, resolution and line size should be sure to be clearly printed). Images and tables and

diagrams/schemes should be placed in columns between groups of text or if too large placed in the middle of the page. Tables should not contain vertical lines, while horizontal lines are allowed but only for the essentials.

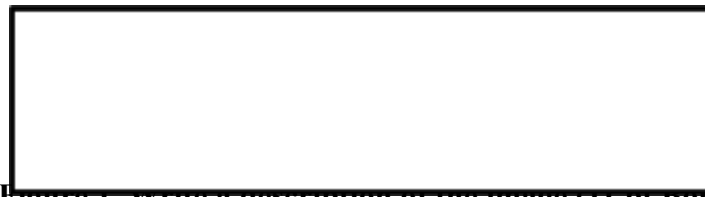


Figure 1. Write a description of the image (11 pt Bold)

The use of tables and figures should be mentioned in the text by mentioning table 1 (the contents of table 11 pt); figure 1 and so on

If necessary, at the end of the conclusion can also be written the things that will be done related to the next idea of the research.

The bibliography must contain reference libraries that come from primary sources (scientific journals and amount to at least 80% of the total bibliography) published in the last 5 (five) years. Each article contains at least 15 (fifteen) reference bibliographies and the last 10 years. Writing a reference system in the text of the article and writing a bibliography should use a reference management application program such as: Mendeley, EndNote, Reference Manager or Zotero. Writing references uses the system model of the APA (*American Psychological Association*), 7th edition.).
