**Study: Anchorage residents surpass national trends** - Anchorage Parks and Recreation Dept. Public Survey of COVID parks and recreation use and attitudes

Anchorage: 55% say they used trails more often; 40% visited parks more often

National: 43% say they will increase participation in certain outdoor recreation activities: general outdoors, hiking, visiting local parks, water sports CivicScience Consumer Survey

Anchorage: 62% say they value parks and open space more since COVID

National: 52% of Americans say they are using local public lands more often & increasing array of rec activities Penn State/Leave No Trace

# Alaska needs to be ready: More federal grants will help put Alaskans back to work

Great American Outdoors Act will double Land and Water Conservation Fund (\$2.5M FY22)

Outdoor recreation intersects with White House climate agenda - Biden executive order creates <u>Civilian</u> <u>Climate Corps</u> including CCC style crews to mitigate wildfire risks, protect watershed health, and improve outdoor recreation access

Transportation priorities include funding for hard & soft-surface outdoor recreation routes and trails; Sen. Dan Sullivan co-sponsors <u>Connecting America's Active Transportation System Act.</u> \$500 million in federal grants to local, regional, and state governments to connect walking & biking infrastructure into active transportation networks
