Types of Questions

Literal (L) = the answer is in the text.

Reorganisation (R) = the answer is in different places in the text

Inference (I) = the answer is suggested and we have to find the clues

Vocabulary (V) = the answer is about the meaning of words

Evaluation (E) = the answer needs us to bring different ideas together

1]. How was rugby 'born'? (R)

A]. In 1823 in England, a boy (William Webb Ellis) was playing football. He picked up the ball and ran with it.

2]. How long since rugby started till it reached New Zealand? (I)

A]. 1823-1870 (+7 +40) = 47

3]. Where did New Zealand's first team tour? (L)

A]. They toured New South Wales in Australia

4]. Why was the first rugby team to go to Britain called 'The Natives'? (I)

A]. Because the team consisted of mostly Māori players - 21 of 26

5]. What were 'The Natives' the first to do? (R)

A]. Perform the haka before all of their matches

6]. What was the Ranfurly Shield supposed to be? (L)

A]. A cup not a shield.

7]. How are The All Blacks thought to have got their name? (R)

A]. Because they wore black shirts is one theory, another is that it was misspelt from All Backs.

8]. In 1921 What did the Springbok players do to insult the Maori culture? (R)

A]. Turned their backs on the cultural performance (poi dance) and refused to shake hands with maori players.

9]. What does *Invincible* mean? (V)

A]. It means that you or your team are unbeatable

10]. Why could George Nepia not tour with the team to South Africa? (I)

A]. Because he was Māori and they refused to play with him on NZ's team.

11]. What caused New Zealanders to protest in 1960? (I)

A]The South African Prime minister refused to let Māori play

12]. What was the 'first time' event in 1971? (I)

A]They lost their first series to the British Lions

13]. Who was the violence between in 1981? (I)

A] Tour protestors, tour supporters and police.

13]. When was the first World Cup played and who was the captain of the All Blacks? (R)

A] David Kirk

14]. When was the first Women's World Cup played and who was the captain of the Black Ferns? (R)

A] Farrah Palmer was the captain and they won gold in 1998.

15]. Why did South Africa apologise to New Zealand? (I)

A] They apologised for refusing to let Māori play in the past.

15]. Do you think the Black Ferns should be paid equally to the All Blacks? Is it fair that they play for pride and passion? Explain your answer (E)

A] Students own answer, must relate to text.
