

This is a chart of the Korean alphabet! I have two posts on my page about how to read and write Korean! Here's the <u>first</u>, and here's the <u>second</u>. If you need any more help, here's a <u>video</u>. Now let's see if you can do it! \odot

- Practice writing/typing out the letters you know first. Then look back at the letters you don't know how to write/read or just aren't familiar with.

TIPS TO KNOW:

- When a syllable ends with either 人, 二, 本 it's said with a "t" or it makes an "ending sound" because it has the sound of stopping. Such as the word 셋, when pronounced it's said as "set" and romanized that way.

[셋 means the number three in Native-Korean]
