TIPS TO KNOW:

- When a syllable ends with either ㄱ, ㄷ, ㅈ it's said with a "t" or it makes an "ending sound" because it has the sound of stopping. Such as the word 셋, when pronounced it's said as "set" and romanized that way.

[셋 means the number three in Native-Korean]
