Felecia Coffee a proud resident of a small borough, in Delaware County, called Collingdale. Mrs.Coffee, has worked diligently as an entrepreneur and non-profit organizational leader over the past two decades, focusing on socioeconomic and sociopolitical issues. In 1998 she founded the 23rd Street Community Association, a community-based organization, providing services and resources to residents and neighbors. After moving to Delaware County, Felecia's 23rd Street Community Association transitioned to become Empowering the Youth of Delaware County, also known as The Empowerment Zone. She provided an outlet for the youth on Saturdays where they were able to express themself through rap. This group was called R.A.P.S.

(Responsible Adolescents Participating in

Solutions). She provided food to the community through her Emergency Food Cupboard, and to date The Empowerment Zone remains the only 24 hour emergency food cupboard in the state of Pennsylvania. The Empowerment Zone also provides affordable prom dresses to high school students, free school supplies, after school services for elementary school students, and other youth engagement activities. Mrs. Coffee owned and operated a community discount store in Collingdale before pursuing her devotion to public service. Her shared passion for community service and civic engagement leading her to making history and becoming the first African-American female mayor, and first Democratic mayor in her local community, promoting a neighborhood of diversity, inclusion, and caring, and taking office just three and half months before the historical COVID-19 pandemic shut the world down.

As a wife of 28 years, a mother of six, and a grandmother of eleven, Felecia Coffee understands the need for all Pennsylvania families to
