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**ABSTRACT:** All articles should be accompanied by an abstract between 200-250 words in 12 point Adobe Caslon Pro, single space. The abstract should be clear, concise, and descriptive. This abstract should provide a brief introduction to the problem, objective of the paper, followed by a statement regarding the methodology and a brief summary of results.

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The introduction (Pendahuluan) describes the background of the article discussed as a whole. The introduction should be written clearly and succinctly, between 3-5 paragraphs only, comprising: (a) an adequate background and significance of your paper; (b) concise previous studies related to the title; (c) the main limitation of the previous studies and what you hope to achieve (to solve the limitation); (d) the scientific merit or novelties of your paper; (e) the aim of the study; (f) structure of the article or research questions.
