What we propose

Title: 4th Sector

Objectives: Raise the largely unnoticed existence of a 4th sector to everyone's consciousness. Outcomes: Build understanding about current change processes and build shared imagination

for the 4th sector.

Session Breakdown

Two complementary sessions where we swarm trust in traditional institutions, and the formalization of the 4th sector.

Both sessions are not panel presentations. We will experiment with co-creation. Our event will feel like a jazz show, a stage where people with great experience think together (jam, dance). It is a different intellectual experience for participants and for those who attend the event as observers it's a show of collective intelligence at play.

This is moving from thinking alone and presenting our own ideas to thinking together and collectively improving our thoughts. That's in tune with the 4th Sector paradigm, swarming a topic rather than carving the event into 15min "real estate" for each presenter from which to project one-to-many.

Intellectual jamming requires excellent mastery of the technical aspects, because one needs to free brain space to process relational information, coordination, synchronization.

Recognizing, differentiating and evaluating 4th Sector initiatives: Towards the institutionalization of the 4th Sector

In this session, we will co-create a tool to identify organizations that belong to the 4th Sector and to distinguish them from organizations in either the private, public or the solidarity sectors. Our starting point will be <u>Pentagrowth</u>, a tool that is already able to treat open network-type organizations. Javier has kindly accepted to facilitate this workshop to find the key markers of 4th Sector entities. Like an X-Ray machine, this tool will highlight the skeleton of an organization and from the structure of its scaffolding we can place the organization into one of the 4 families or sectors. This would be a first concrete step towards recognition and legitimization of the 4th sector, one step closer for building interfaces between the emerging 4th Sector and the rest of society. Note: The first session will set the stage for the second one. The hypothesis is that if trust in key institutions, those who are correlated with socioeconomic prosperity, is undermined, there is a window of opportunity for something new to emerge and gain adoption. The 4th Sector might be that new thing.

More Context:

The problems that today threaten the health of our natural environment, the sustainability of our economies and even our ways of life, are proving so complex and interconnected as to have inspired new kinds of collaborations and organizations - referred to as the *4th Sector*. In parallel to these pressures to find radically new approaches, a new potential has been introduced by the development of new digital technologies, which has sparked the development of a new shared imagination and a new culture, giving birth to new approaches. In other words, new wicked problems have met an army of unaware nerds thinking with new technologies. The hivemind has seized these new tools and adopted the new culture to form the 4th Sector. When successful, 4th Sector ventures produce radically new opportunities for innovation and entrepreneurship.

Fourth (4th) Sector is a space for experimentation with new organizational and economic models. People organize in open networks, using the Internet to communicate and coordinate actions on the ground. These networks are organic, dynamic, and versatile. They don't need a head office or a legal entity to represent them. They are not Coops, Nonprofits, or Inc-s, they are creatures of the 4th Sector. Open networks are new channels for latent social potential, but face insurmountable institutional barriers. These new types of organizations have real impact but their structure and governance are not recognized by our institutions, as if they didn't exist.

What is the **vocation** of the event, aim, scope, ...

The central theme of this event is Community-based science and innovation. This event will provide an opportunity for participants to get to know each other, identify areas of alignment between our respective communities, and lay the groundwork for a second larger summit in the winter.

The event will encompass approximately 10 tracks containing up to 2 hours of programming each. The content and format of each track is decided by the Track Lead in coordination with their partners/collaborators.

(The larger 2-day summit planned for the winter will leverage the relationships we've formed during the summer event to bring in a larger community of practitioners drawn primarily from the networks of the Track Leads. Track leaders will take the experience they've gained from participating in the beta summit to recruit additional track leaders and speakers representing a larger diversity of subject areas. In this way, track leaders like you will have greater opportunity to shape your programming to deliver the most value to your local network, and we collectively will have more opportunity to improve our approach to provide a better user experience to participants.)
