8th grade Civics: Presidents Project

Introduction:

Presidents impact the eras they govern in. Each of their decisions both at home in the United States (Domestic Affairs) and away in other countries (Foreign Affairs) impact the wider world. All presidents face challenges and successes in their domestic and foreign affairs. Your job will research these successes and failures so that you can begin to get a sense of how our past leaders' actions have an impact on our country today.

Performance Indicators:

1c (CIVICS). I can describe how presidents make important decisions at the national level.

3e (HISTORICAL INQUIRY). I can explain and evaluate the contributions, challenges, and influences of a historically significant person.

4d (CRITICAL THINKING). I can use evidence from sources to strengthen my claims.

Your Task:

You are a historian and you work at a presidential library. You are tasked with <u>designing a</u> <u>Google Site for student visitors to explore</u>, where you showcase your president's triumphs and outline the greatest challenges of their presidency. You will work to analyze and clearly explain the influence of a president on the US and the world.

Each person will research the president's response to a significant decision in **Domestic Affairs** (issues in the United States) **and one in Foreign Affairs** (issues involving other countries). When you research <u>each issue</u>, you want to focus on...

- What was the cause or background? i.e. what led the president to do what he did?
- What was it what did the president do? i.e. explain the law, action, order, or decision to someone who doesn't know
- How did the president's actions influence the US? i.e. did the president's action affect the US and world positively—or did it flop? How do you know?

Required content pieces:

- 1. Summary of key events in **Domestic Affairs**
- 2. Summary of key events in Foreign Affairs
- 3. A popular culture section what was cool? Movies, TV, music, games, style
- 4. A **header section** with title, picture of your president and the years they served.
- 5. A picture for each section of the website of your president as well as pictures for your **pop culture** section.
- 6. A MLA formatted Works Cited page.
- 7. **Exceeding option: rate your president on a scale of 1-5 (five being the highest) based on your research. Complete a 3-5 sentence paragraph on why you rated the president like that.

TO MEET PROFICIENCY:

- Information is supported with evidence and organized into logical sections on your site.
- You cite at least 3 different, reliable sources of information from the library LibGuide.
- The vast majority of the writing on your site is in your own words. Direct quotes are allowed if properly punctuated and cited—especially if they are the exact words of the president, used for emphasis.
- All sources used to gather information for your website are cited in MLA style, both in-text and on a Works Cited page. (*This includes information that is paraphrased AND information that is directly quoted from a source. Copying and pasting information from any source without quoting/citing it is plagiarism and will affect your final assessment.)

TO EXCEED PROFICIENCY, YOU MUST ALSO...

EVALUATE YOUR PRESIDENT: Once you complete your site, create one additional section. In this "OVERALL RATING" section, you will synthesize what you've learned and evaluate the president's foreign and domestic policies.

Include:

An overall rating of 1-5 stars of the president's DOMESTIC policies
An overall rating of 1-5 starts for the president's FOREIGN policies
A 5+ sentence paragraph justifying your rating with specific examples, research, and
reasoning.

• To share each other's work, we will do a project scavenger hunt. Give your teacher two questions about your President that can be answered within your google site. As an added bonus, point out any easter eggs that might be there.
