- **Thursday, February 26:** All course selections must be entered in PowerSchool

With graduation just over four months away, we want to make sure parents have all the information needed at their fingertips. As a reminder, the graduation ceremony will take place on Tuesday, June 2, 2026 at 5pm at the Breslin Center on the campus of MSU. There are no tickets needed and graduates can invite as many friends and family as they'd like!

Beginning with the Class of 2026, completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) — or submitting an opt-out waiver — will be a graduation requirement in Michigan. The FAFSA is a free form that determines eligibility for federal, state, and college financial aid, which

can be used for skilled trades programs, community college, and four-year universities. Students who do complete the FAFSA will be eligible to choose from one of the following rewards: Prom Ticket, \$50 Amazon Gift Card, or Senior All Night Party ticket (rewards are made possible through a MiLeap grant).
