



ENGLISH AS A NEW LANGUAGE

English as a New Language is an integrated course based on the *WIDA English Language Development (ELD) Standards* and *Indiana's Academic Standards for World Languages*. ENL is the study of language, literature, composition, and oral communication for Limited English Proficient (LEP) students. The courses are designed to improve proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, writing, and comprehension of standard English. Students study English vocabulary used in fictional texts and content-area texts, and speak and write so that they can function effectively within the regular school setting and an English-speaking society. They also deliver oral presentations appropriate to their respective levels of English proficiency.

Credits: World Language (2188) ENL course work addresses Indiana's Academic Standards for World Languages and is taken concurrently with an English/Language Arts course; up to 6 credits accrued may count as World Language credits for all diplomas.

Credit: 2-semester course, one credit per semester - Students can take up to 6 semesters.
