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Impact of Work:

I managed all social media accounts and analyzed data based on the number of followers, impressions, or interactions each post had. These were organized into spreadsheets and each post from September all the way up until December are recorded by me. One of the main ways we increase our outreach is through social media and it also shows how many people are following are social media handles to increase our possibilities of donations. I also wrote thank letters to donors and sent them out during out big donation month/event of Bridge to Health. Thank the donors let them know our progress and their impact as a donors. In addition, I organized donor information through spreadsheets and updated them with names, donor amount, date. Using creativity, I also create flyers for WellShare to show case mental health tips and any promotional ideas for whatever they needed. Because I was working remotely, I could not be there with my supervisor and at times there were many miscommunications because she would send me emails of my tasks for the day but they would be once sentence only.
