I. SCHOOL CURRENT SITUATION

CHAPTER 4

Monitoring and Evaluation

MONITORING AND EVALUATION PLAN

A. Tools

D. COMMUNICATION, DOCUMENTATION AND REPORTING TO THE STAKEHOLDERS

A. Communication Plan

The School Report Card (SRC) Monitoring and Evaluation shall serve as the tool to promote the educational programs and projects being undertaken in the school and at the same time, to broadcast its accomplishments and the generosity and concern of its stakeholder

B. Schedule of Reporting to Stakeholders

The School Report Card will be presented to the stakeholders twice a year, i.e. at the end of the semester, November and April/May. General PTA meetings/ assembly are also scheduled at the start and end of the school year, where in the School Report Card will also be presented to the parents.

C. Documentation Plan

Practices major and minor accomplishment in the improvement of its physical facilities, instructional and management practices shall be properly reported for reference and record purposes. Pictorials and reports are published, properly kept and recorded.
