To commemorate the 250th anniversary of the USA, the Mint produced commemorative coins for circulation. The penny is a penny with 1776-2026 on it and it is not for circulation. The same is for the nickel, it has 1776-2026 but is for circulation. The circulating dimes, quarters and half dollars have a liberty head and the 1776-2026 date. There are 5 types of the 2026 quarter. The proof silver eagle for 2026 has the 1776-2026 date and also has a liberty bell privy mark with the number 250 on it.

HOW TO FIX A FLAT BIKE TIRE

To fix a bike tire you unscrew the axles on the flat wheel to remove the wheel from the bike. Then you will use tire levers to pry the tire off the rim. You will take the tube out of the tire. If the hole is small you can patch it if you have a patch kit. Otherwise you get another tube of the same size. The size is on the side of the tire. You put the tire back on the rim with one side off, then put the valve in the valve hole and push the tube back into the tire. Then you use the tire levers to put both sides of the tire on the rim. Once the tire and tube are on the rim, place the wheel back on the bike and tighten the axle. Then you pump the tire to the pressure in the side of the tire. For Mountain Bikes the tire pressure is around 30-50 psi and for road bikes it is around 80-105 psi.



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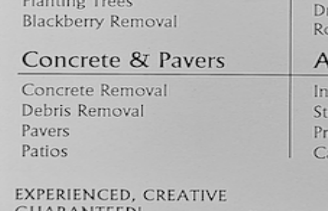
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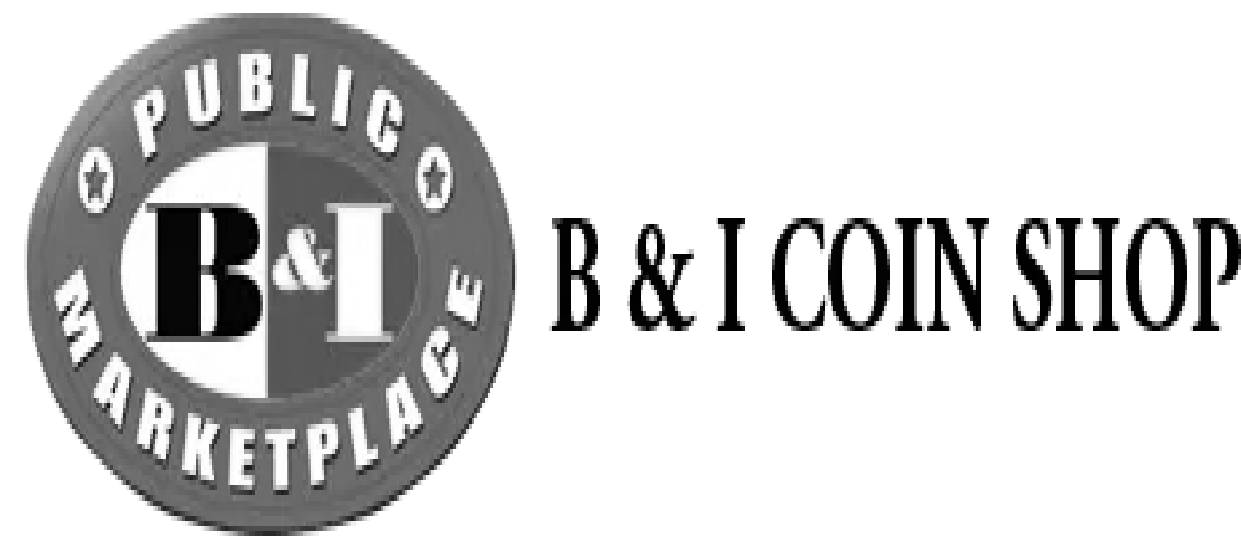
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
