Guidance Update:

- **ASVAB Test:** The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test for entrance into the military will be administered at the high school for interested Juniors and Seniors on **Thursday, March 25**. Students who are interested should sign up by Monday, March 22, either in the Guidance Office or via Google Form that was sent out to student's school emails. On Monday (3/22), students will have the opportunity to attend a study session with a military recruiter.
- **FAFSA for College Bound Seniors:** FAFSA completion rates are down across the country. A lot of the money will go unclaimed if we don't increase the number of students completing the FAFSA. If you have a college-bound senior for this fall, fill out the FAFSA as soon as possible at fafsa.gov !
- **College Credit Plus (CCP) Night:** This year's annual CCP night was held virtually on 3/4. If you missed the meeting, parents and students should watch the recording of the meeting in order to be eligible to participate in the CCP program next year. The link to the recording is available on our [website](#). All students must fill out the required paperwork before May 1 (available in the Guidance Office). Students who are new to CCP must also apply to Sinclair using their CCP application (these steps are also listed on our website).
- **Scheduling for 2021-22:** The counselors have met with most students individually to review their course selections and discuss future plans. Counselors will be following up with absent students next week. A copy of student's course requests will be mailed home after spring break so parents can review student course selections.

Franklin City Schools is excited to announce that we will be continuing the free lunch program for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year.

USDA has announced that they will continue to make meals free to all children in our district through May 27, 2021. We are asking that you still fill out a free and reduced form if you haven't yet this school year, if you feel you might qualify. If you qualify, school fees may also be waived. 2020-2021 Free and Reduced Lunch Paperwork:

We have multiple families that have still not submitted their Free and Reduced Lunch Applications for the 2020-2021 school year. We suspect this is because all students get free lunch this year. **However, without that paperwork on file, we cannot waive students' school fees.** In addition, our percentage of students that qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch is tied to our state and federal funding, and we want to make sure the percentage we receive is a true reflection of our students and families. Seniors/Class of 2021 and Lunch Charges:

As of Monday January 11th, no Seniors are allowed to charge any extra items if their account has a negative balance. We will be accepting payments starting Monday January 11th from the hours of 7:15-12:45pm in the FHS Cafeteria. Payments can also be made online through [EZpay](#) with no fee added.

Quarantine Updates: (Posted on the FCS Website 1/7/21)

A message to district families -

The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) put out new guidance regarding quarantining at K-12 schools. If a student or teacher is exposed in the classroom setting to someone with COVID-19, quarantine is not recommended for the exposed child or staff member as long as those exposed were wearing masks. A change in quarantine procedures does not apply in the cafeteria or for extra-curriculars. Existing quarantining procedures will continue for those areas. The Warren County Public Health supports these changes in procedures.

Before this change, any student or staff member that was within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more of someone that was COVID-19 positive had to quarantine. A study was recently completed in Ohio that examined the positivity rates of those in quarantine based on school exposure. It showed that, in a supervised classroom setting, there was no discernable difference in rates of COVID-19 among students who were close contacts with someone with the disease and students in the same grade who were not close contacts.

As we welcome back all our students on Monday, January 11, 2021, for the start of the second semester, we will continue to monitor information both internally, in the community, and around the state. If changes are needed to the schedule we will do everything we can to inform you as soon as possible. We believe that these changes in quarantine procedures, though, will dramatically increase our chances of maintaining in-person learning while at the same time providing a safe and secure learning environment.
