The discussion section should describe the implementation, challenges faced, impacts, and efforts for sustaining the results of the service.

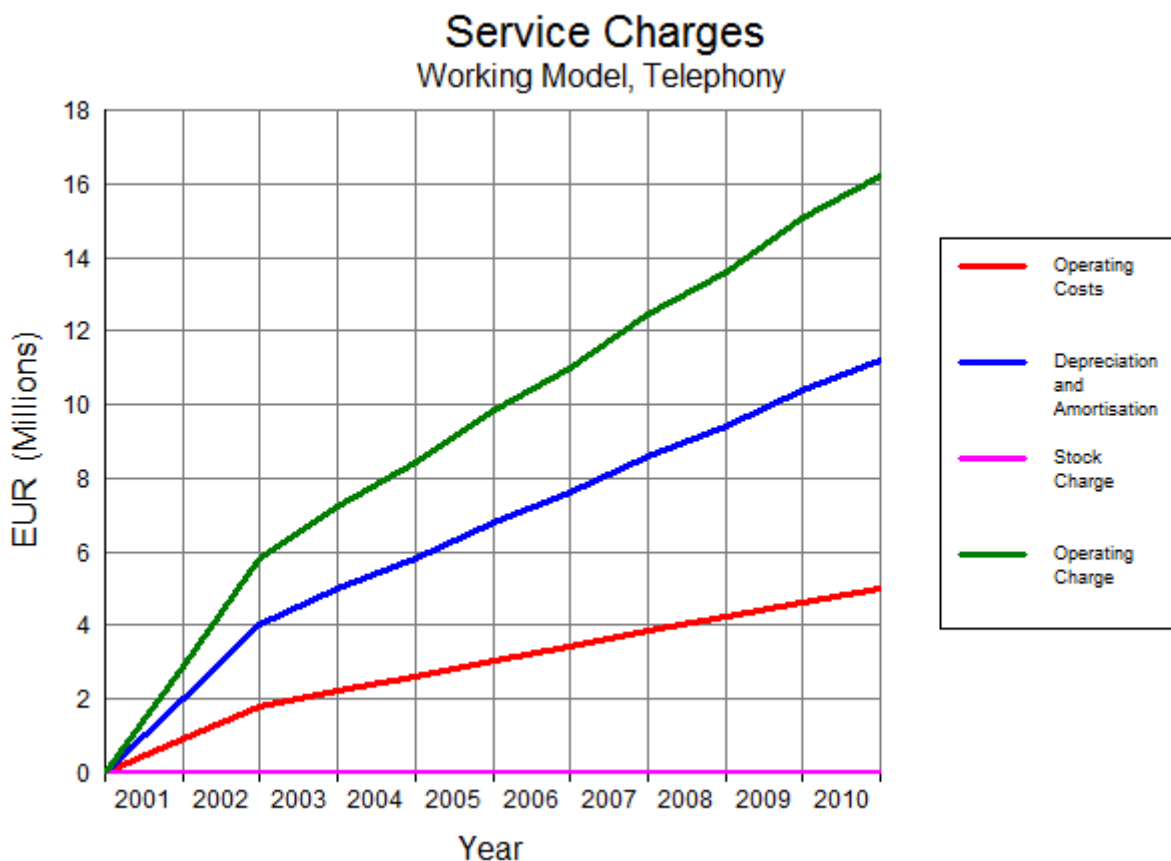


Figure.1 XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX [Times New Roman 10]

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Format for Writing Scientific Articles

A. General Provisions

1. **Originality of the Article**

The article must be an original work about the results of community service activities.

2. **Publication Status**

The article must not have been published previously and should not be under review by any other journal.

3. **Formatting and Layout**

The article should be typed with 1.0 spacing, Times New Roman font, and using A4 paper size.

Figures and tables should appear consecutively at the end of the manuscript on separate sheets.

4. **Length of the Article**

The article should be a maximum of 20 pages, including references, figures, and tables.

5. **File Format**

The article should be saved in the file format: [JWA]Main Author's Name_ Title (3 words).doc or .docx (Microsoft Word).

The file should be uploaded online to the OJS/PKP Platform & Workflow at <http://wartaandalas.lppm.unand.ac.id/>.

6. **Plagiarism Statement**

B. Writing Systematics

1. **Title**

The title should be written in both Indonesian and English. It must be specific, effective, and limited to a maximum of 20 words.

2. **Author Information**

The names of all authors should be written without abbreviations or academic titles. The names of all institutions should be included, along with the email address of the main author.

3. **Abstract**

The abstract should be written in both Indonesian and English, with a maximum of 200 words. It should cover the reasons for selecting the topic or the importance of the community service/research topic, the methods used, and a summary of the results.

4. **Keywords**

Keywords should be written in both Indonesian and English (each consisting of 3-5 words), listed alphabetically below the abstract.

5. **Introduction**

The introduction should present the background and objectives of the activity in concise, clear, and effective sentences.

6. **Methodology**

The methodology section should include information on the location and sequence of activities, materials and tools used, methods of implementation, data collection methods, and data processing and analysis.

7. **Results and Discussion**

This section should discuss the implementation of the activity, challenges faced, impact, and sustainability efforts. Results and discussion can be presented in text, tables, or figures.

8. **Conclusion**

The conclusion should summarize the significance of the activity results in relation to the objectives of the community service. It should also provide suggestions or policy recommendations for the sustainability of the program.

9. **References**

A minimum of 15 references should be included. The references should follow the American Psychological Association (APA) 7th Edition citation style. All citations must be relevant to the article's topic, covering books, journals, articles, and other reputable sources.

10. **Acknowledgements**

If applicable, this section should mention sources of funding for the activity, and any other relevant acknowledgements regarding the article's content.

11. **Similarity Index**
