Two Oshkosh brothers, in service with the same unit since their entry into the service together, were separated in England recently, according to information brought directly and unexpected-Tellekson, ly by Corp. Merle when he arrived at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. T. C. Tellekson, 55 Mill street, to spend several days.

The surprise of seeing the son alone was soon relieved when Corporal Tellekson explained that he had been selected as one of six, from a group of 100 taken from overseas duty and sent back to the states for training at West Point. The young soldier will leave Sunday for La Follett Prep school at Easton, Pa., where he will be located until next spring when he will go to West Point.

Both mechanics in a ground crew of the Eighth air force, Corporal Tellekson and his brother, Corp. Theodore Tellekson, entered the service Jan. 6, 1943 and received training together at Keesler Field, Biloxi, Miss., and the Boeing aircreft school at Seattle, Wash. They arrived overseas Dec. 15, 1943. Both are holders of the overseas ribbon and presidential citation, the latter of which was awarded all members of the unit for outstanding performance of duty. Promotions to the grade of corporal were received by the brothers on the day their squadron completed its 100th mission.
