Nurse Updates

Meningococcal Vaccine

Any student 16 or over must receive a second meningococcal vaccine known as a meningococcal booster. This is not to be confused with a meningococcal B vaccine which is not needed for high school. Please send in proof of the vaccine to the health office.

Grades 11-12

2 doses; second dose MenACWY (formerly MCV4) must be given on or after the 16th birthday and ≥ 8 weeks after the previous dose. 1 dose is acceptable if it was given on or after the 16th birthday. Meningococcal B vaccine is not required and does not meet this requirement

Epi pens/Life Threatening Allergies

All students who are prescribed an epi pen for life threatening allergies must have an epi pen available during school and at all school sponsored events. A medical order from a prescriber and parental consent form must be sent in each school year. Please send in the <u>forms</u> and epi pens asap so that your child has access to this life saving medication. Please print and send to the health office upon completion.

Math Department Updates

The math department is taking a field trip to Worcester Polytechnic Institute on Friday October 20th to participate in WPI's Annual Invitational Mathematics Meet:

"The contest will consist of two rounds of competition. The first round will be individual competition and the second round will be a team effort. Both rounds will consist of interesting and challenging questions based on the secondary mathematics curriculum up to, but not including, calculus. Following the meet, there will be a short program to introduce the students to WPI, as well as a talk about pursuing degrees and careers in the mathematical sciences. In addition, WPI will provide lunch and a free WPI Mathematics Meet T-shirts to all the participants and their advisors."

Southeastern Massachusetts Mathematics League Competition and the Atlantic-Pacific Mathematics Competition:

The Math Team has started to meet every Thursday from 2:30-3:00 in order to prepare for their first travel competition on November 2nd. The Math Team participates in the Southeastern Massachusetts Mathematics League Competition, where students travel once a month to local schools and compete against other students. The team also participates in the Atlantic-Pacific Mathematics Competition, meeting once a month and working on 6 challenging math problems at OA. The students submit their scores online to see how they stand up to schools in our area and across the country. The first home competition is scheduled for November 16th. In addition, there are opportunities to learn about math topics beyond the high school curriculum, and to volunteer with helping students in the lower grades with Math skills during the year.

Science Department Updates

AP Bio students used collaborative, inquiry-based lab design skills to investigate why termites follow a line.







Anatomy students worked on their relative terms of position and were introduced to dissecting tools through a "pickle cadaver" lab. Students got to use their investigative skills and creativity to determine the cause of death (which included acidic blood or falling into a sandwich!)





Physics students started the year with a Tower-building challenge using minimal materials to simulate Team problem-solving skills and the Engineering process.

Physics students completed a constant velocity data collection and digital graphing activity.




