• How do I leave a GoodReads review?

- o Go to <u>www.goodreads.com</u>
- Click "Sign up with email" and use your MELS email address to create a GoodReads account if you do not already have one.
- Set a reading goal for 2025.
- After you finish each book you read this summer, rate it out of 5 stars, and write a review (at least 1 paragraph). You are encouraged to read others' reviews as well.
