Heartstrings Week 3: Heartstring of Fear

I. Introduction: Setting the Stage

- Opening: Congregation greeting, continuing the series on generosity.
- **Main Goal:** Narrowing the topic of generosity into one takeaway: *Generosity frees us from the fear of trusting God with finances.*
 - Acknowledge that people may not remember everything, but emphasize this key point.

II. Personal Struggle with Stewardship

- Story of Motorcycles: Personal example of unwise financial decisions.
 - o Bought three motorcycles before even owning a car.
 - These decisions were not aligned with being a good steward of God's resources.
- Relating to the Audience: Struggling with stewardship is common, and you are not alone in it.

III. The Fear of Trusting God with Finances

- Fear and Money:
 - Many resist donating or giving time, holding tightly to "hard-earned" money.
 - Introduce the concept of FEAR:
 - 1. Finances
 - 2. Entice
 - 3. Active
 - 4. **R**esistance
 - Money becomes an idol, dethroning God.
- Fear's Impact: It attaches itself to our hearts, making it difficult to trust God with our finances.

IV. Biblical Example: The Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:24-25)

- The Fear of the Servant: He buried his talent out of fear of losing it, not trusting his master.
- Deeper Meaning: This parallels Christians receiving God's blessings but doing nothing with them out of fear.
- Inaccurate Perspective of God: Like the servant, we may have a distorted view of God, leading to fear and inaction.
- Reflection: We can't keep money anyway, so why fear losing it?

V. What Should We Focus On?

- Shift in Focus: Instead of clinging to temporary wealth, we should focus on eternal investments.
- 1 Timothy 6:18-19: Generosity lays a foundation for eternal life.
- Luke 16:9: Relationships and kingdom investment outlast worldly wealth.
- Call to Radical Generosity: Not just tithing, but living a life of radical generosity by pouring into those around us.

VI. A Challenge to Live Generously

- Jim Elliott's Quote: "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose."
- Core Truth of Generosity: We are only stewards of what God gives us—nothing is truly ours to lose.
- Reflection Questions:
 - Are you living the true life that God promises?
 - What would it look like to live a life of radical generosity?
- Conclusion: Living generously frees us from fear and opens us to the true source of life.

VII. Closing Prayer and Reflection

- **Prayer:** For courage to trust God with finances and live a life of radical generosity.
- Challenge: Encourage everyone to take steps in generosity this week, making it a priority in their lives.
