Financial Update Erin Koht	 ★ Fall Festival: We made \$42k and spent \$19k ★ Next year, we probably need to increase the budgets ★ We had to increase the CPA budget to \$1400 ★ We have \$21,036.37 that we are projected

- for this year, assuming Gala stays on projections
- ★ Haven't gotten a check from Mom & Pop Chicken Shop Dine Out Night yet
- ★ Doughnuts came right on budget
- ★ Based on budget at beginning of the year, projecting a loss of approx \$3k
- ★ Based on actual revenue, cost of goods, expenses, and operating, projecting net income of \$22k
- ★ School funding for aides has been able to help students with SIPS program, and working one-on-one or with small groups of students to help with their learning needs.
- ★ We need to increase the budget for a new CPA because it's hard to find a CPA willing to take on a new nonprofit.

District gives schools a choice in how to apply that standard. We have used Arts Attack, but that is outdated. We've been looking for an arts program for the last 3-4 years. The teachers have all come to a decision to use this program (Meet the Masters) We are one of the few schools in the district that doesn't have an arts program. 	 Dance and ceramics are extras on top of state standards for art. We would need to fund an art teacher in the future. It would be around \$90k over the next 6 years. After 6 years, we would only have to fund the teacher, which would be around \$9,000. The program itself isn't that expensive. It's around \$3k (but Laurisa doesn't have her notes in front of her). But the supplies (e.g., paints, watercolors, etc.) are expensive too. So while subsequent years will be less expensive, it won't be a lot less expensive. We'll table this issue until the next meeting.
