HVAC salary - Overview

The heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration technician is responsible for installing, maintaining, and repairing HVAC systems.

A person who works in this occupation might specialize in installation or maintenance and repair instead of those two areas.

While some technicians specialize in a single system, such as heating, air conditioning, or refrigeration, others provide a more comprehensive range of services.

This line of work offers good pay within a pretty wide range depending on one's abilities, years of experience, and geographic location.

The typical annual base salary of an HVAC Technician is \$37,000.

This number fluctuates depending on the tasks that HVAC Technicians must complete.

Because residential HVAC Technicians do not face the same kinds of obstacles in their line of work as their commercial or industrial counterparts, residential HVAC Technician salaries are significantly lower.

Depending on experience level and company size, residential technicians can make as much as \$55,000 per year, while commercial technicians can make as much as \$68,000 per year.

It is essential to remember that the figures mentioned earlier represent averages and that not all HVAC professionals earn this income level throughout their careers.

Factors Affecting HVAC salary

There is a wide range of pay for Industrial/commercial HVAC Technicians depending on the job type and location.

However, it is essential to first consider the business in which the technician is employed.

Several businesses have an array of options for the amount of money they may offer their employees for providing HVAC services.

A commercial technician's residence location is another component determining how much money they make annually.

With the high living expenses in some regions, the hourly wage for technicians will vary depending on the location.

In Arkansas, an HVAC Technician can earn a yearly salary of \$37,918.

The average earnings for a Refrigeration Technician in Minnesota are approximately \$52,000 per year.

The average annual income for an HVAC Mechanic is close to \$50,000, which places this occupation among the top-paying jobs in the country.

Average Salary By Work Experience

Like any other profession, the salaries of HVAC Technicians are determined by several factors, including how many years they've worked in the specialty.

With less than a year of experience, HVAC Technicians make an average hourly wage of \$23.19.

With three to five years of experience, HVAC Technicians can expect an average hourly wage of \$22.96.

An HVAC Technician with 6 to 9 years of experience can expect to make a median hourly wage of \$28.54.

With ten or more years of experience, HVAC Technicians can expect an average hourly wage of \$33.89.

How much does an HVAC Technician make - Workplace Setting?

HVAC Salaries are also determined by company size and organization setup. As a result, small-sized companies expectedly will pay less than Silicon Valley companies.


