Abstract

Abstracts are written with EB Garamond (14 pt) and preferably not more than 250 words. The abstract should be clear, concise, and descriptive. This abstract should provide a brief introduction to the problem, the paper's objective, followed by a statement regarding the methodology, and a concise summary of the results. Abstract should be written in Formal English, consist of: research purposes, main problems, method, findings, and conclusion. An abstract should be standalone, meaning there are no citations within it. Abstract

should directly explain the topic discussed. Abstract should also reflect the whole content of the manuscript/paper.

I. Introduction

The introduction should contain at least five previous studies related to the topic. At this point, the author should emphasize the urgency and significance of the research. The author must also explore and combine previous studies. It is essential for readers to understand the uniqueness, novelty, urgency, and significance of the research. Most readers are non-native English speakers; therefore, authors should use a formal, simple language. Additionally, for international readers, authors also need to incorporate and enhance global perspectives.

The introduction should be clear and provide a clear description of the issue to be discussed in the manuscript. Before the objective, authors should provide an adequate background, and very short literature survey in order to record the existing solutions, to show which is the best of previous studies, to show the main limitation of the previous studies, to show what do you hope to achieve (to solve the limitation), and to show the scientific merit or novelties of the paper.

Citation should be in the footnote model. The author must use the Mendeley citation software, and the citation model should be set to Chicago Manual Style (Fullnote) automatically by Mendeley. The author should use at least 30 references (the latest in the past five years). The footnotes used in references in this journal are not only used as source credit for the reference, but it is highly recommended for the author to write some notes, arguments, or brief reviews in the footnotes. Thus, footnotes are not only limited to a reference source, but also notes from the author. At the end of the paragraph, the author/s should end with a comment on the significance of concerning identification of the issue and the objective of the research.

Minimum length of manuscript is 6000 words, including footnote (exclude abstract and references). All submitted manuscripts are read by the editorial staff. Those manuscripts evaluated by editors to be inappropriate to the journal criteria are rejected promptly without external review. Manuscripts evaluated to be of potential interest to our readership are sent to double blind reviewers. The editors then make a decision based on the reviewer's recommendation from among several possibilities: rejected, require major revision, need minor revision, or accepted.

Submitted manuscripts will generally be reviewed by two or more experts who will be asked to evaluate whether the manuscript is scientifically sound and coherent, whether it duplicates already published work, and whether or not the manuscript is sufficiently clear for publication. The Editors will reach a decision based on these reports and, where necessary, they will consult with members of the Editorial Board.

II. Method

The method is presented in a descriptive form and should provide a statement outlining the research methodology. This method utilizes as much information as possible to provide the reader with an idea of the methods employed. Both Research and Review Articles should explain the method. For the research article, it is clear that the method should describe the location of the study, the data collection method, and how the data were analyzed. Meanwhile, in the Review Article, the method is described in detail regarding the topic being analyzed, including the theories and laws used to analyze it, as well as the study's limitations.

III. First Sub-Title

This section is the most important section of your article. The analysis or results of the research should be clear and concise. The results should summarize (scientific) findings rather than providing data in great detail. Please highlight the differences between your results or findings and the previous publications by other researchers.

The figures should be clearly readable and have a resolution of at least 300 DPI (Dots Per Inch) for optimal printing quality.
