


<b>LESSON TITLE:</b> Windows At Night	<b>LESSON GOAL:</b> The students will use different crafting techniques to create a windows at night art.
<b>BOOK:</b> <a href="#">Windows</a> by Julia Denos & E.B. Goodale	<p><u>Introduction:</u> The book today is about a boy who goes on a walk at dusk. Who knows what dusk is?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <a href="#">Link to Video Book</a></li> <li>2. Ask:           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What time of day did the boy go for a walk?</li> <li>• What did he notice about windows?</li> <li>• How did the boy feel when he saw his mom in the window?</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
<p><b>ACTIVITY:</b> <a href="#">Windows at Night craft</a></p>  <p><b>SUPPLIES NEEDED:</b> Blue Construction paper, Rulers, Pencils, Colorful construction paper scraps and strips, Glitter, Foil stars and Glitter (optional), Scissors, Glue</p>	<p><u>Introduction:</u> How did the pictures of the windows at night make you feel? (discuss)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have the students show their pictures and talk about how they felt when they were creating the picture. <p><b>GROUP GAME:</b> <u>Developmental Goal:</u> To develop teamwork, depth-perception, and eye-hand and eye-foot coordination. <u>Equipment Needed:</u> Balls</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Read through the game instructions ahead of time so that you can teach the activity.</li> <li>2. Use an attention-getter to gather students and make sure they are listening.</li> <li>3. Explain the game, the rules, and how to play the game.</li> <li>4. Check for understanding, have a few kids and staff demonstrate play.</li> <li>5.
