She serves as your mentor. • The program is run at a community center, not a school, but the "classrooms" are more than adequate.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In the 21-22 school year, Seen 52 piloted Project re:Fresh, which offered middle and high school youth in Alameda County a unique opportunity to refresh their understanding of what it means to be a friend, a student, a community member, and most importantly, a valued human being through project-based and place-based learning. • This is an interdisciplinary, 4.5-week project encompasses student choice, agency, depth of learning, exploration, and growth mindset. • Two three-week deep dives on Rocketry or Bay Area Exploration. One three-week session in Oakland and one in Hayward. • A team for 4 lead teachers with a group of about 15 students. • Collaborate with learning guide team to support grade band cohort and learners with diverse needs • Facilitate and guide daily elective activities that promote learning by doing • Support with advisory

There will be 16 sites this summer, live and in-person. • Aim High serves 1800 students in SF, Oakland, Richmond, San Rafael, Novato, Napa, East Palo Alto, Tahoe/Truckee • Students are going into 6th-9th grade. • Program is looking into ways for students to meet in person outside for short periods of time. • This program is designed to prepare students for high school and college, and to stem summer learning loss. The students take three classes, STEAM, Book Club, and Issues and Choices in the morning, and have electives and field trips in the afternoon. • You teach 3 classes in the AM, have a prep period, and teach an elective in the PM. • This program is over 30 years old and is a national model. • BATTI residents join as lead teachers, associates or volunteers. Leads are paired with one or two H.S./College aged teaching interns. • 250 hours of pay - New Lead Teachers at \$25/hour, Assistant Teachers start at \$18/hour • Lead Teachers (Credentialed and Aspiring Teachers in residence programs) are now eligible to receive up to 2 Continuing Education Units and Aim High will pay for them

- SMART provides a unique 12-year continuum of support that starts in 4th grade and goes all the way through college, including school support, after-school enrichment, summer programming, and college preparation.
- Recruitment starts in 4th grade. SMART identifies 4th grade students who are driven to learn but face barriers to opportunity.
- SMART’s Summer Academic Enrichment Program serves rising 5th and 6th grade students to prevent and reduce instances of summer learning loss, while providing enriching activities to develop and strengthen the positive bonds of youth to their peers and communities.
- The program’s academic curriculum is centered around literacy and math curricula, and offers enrichment courses in areas such as science, media, dance, coding, sports, and more. Oriday Scholars participate in STEM-based field trips designed to expose them to the sciences outside of the classroom environment.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The student population is made up of approx. 50% Latino, 30% African American, and 10% Asian. • Students enroll because they need support. • Classes are from 9:00-12:30 five (occasionally four) days a week. • BATTI teachers work as a volunteer under the guidance of a lead teacher/mentor or in a lead role. BATTI will hire a mentor/supervisor who will meet with you twice a week, if not more. • The curriculum subjects are reading and science. • Pay is contingent upon becoming hired as a sub with the school district. It is also possible to VOLUNTEER, which means you'll have a lower lift. • Students are in grades K-5. • There are 15 students in each class. • The program is five weeks long. • There are additional evening and weekend training sessions required in May. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You work as a TA with a strong lead teacher mentor and the support of a Curriculum and Instructional Lead, a Reading Specialist and a Wellness Coach • The program was launched in 2014 to help address the city's need for high quality summer learning opportunities for students from low income backgrounds. • Horizons works with grades K-8th, 17 students per class • The majority of Horizons' students identify as Latinx/Hispanic • Six week summer program working with elementary and middle school students from Mission District public schools • The academic focus on literacy and STEM is paired with an emphasis on social emotional learning and restorative justice classroom practices • Horizons requires you to attend one week of paid professional development prior to the start of the summer session • Salary: \$24-26/hr for TA's and \$31-36/hr for Lead Teachers
