Results and Discussion

This section presents the findings obtained using the described methods. The results are not raw data, but rather data that has been processed/analyzed using established methods. The discussion compares the results with existing theories or literature. The content may include statements, tables, figures, diagrams, graphs, and sketches. The text is in Times New Roman font, size 11.

The manuscript must include at least 10 scientific literature sources in the bibliography, with a minimum of 80% being primary references. Primary references include sources such as journals, research reports, theses, dissertations, and conference proceedings from the last 10 years. Secondary references include sources such as books and internet sources. It is recommended to use a reference management application, such as Mendeley, for citation formatting.

The manuscript must be typed using *Microsoft Word* on A4-sized paper with 3 cm margins on all sides. The text must be 1.5 spaced, except for the title, abstract, and reference list, which should be single-spaced. The font used is Times New Roman, size 11. The file must be written using *Microsoft Office*. Images should be added as JPG or TIFF files. The maximum manuscript length is 12 pages. The manuscript must meet the standards of a scientific paper and be free from plagiarism, following this structure: (1) Title, (2) Abstract, (3) Introduction, (4) Materials and Methods, (5) Results and Discussion, (6) Conclusion, (7) Acknowledgment (if applicable), (8) References.

Writing units of measurement using the International System (SI).

The writing of decimal numbers in manuscripts for Indonesian is separated by a comma (,) and for English by a period (.).

Latin names are italicized. The full chemical name is used for the compound at first mention.

The table should provide clear, complete, and independent information (understandable even without manuscript text). Table titles are numbered and must use the same font as the text. The dividing line is horizontal and consists of three lines, two at the top (head of the table) and one at the end of the table (vertical lines are not allowed). Any abbreviations or symbols are explained below the table.

Figures and Graphs. Figure and graph titles are numbered and must use the same font as the text. The size of the figures and graphs must still be clearly legible if the size is reduced up to 50%. Columnar graphs are made in two dimensions with fill in the form of shading and are not solid or block colors other than black. Line-shaped graphs must use a different line style.
