Adobe Spark in Classroom

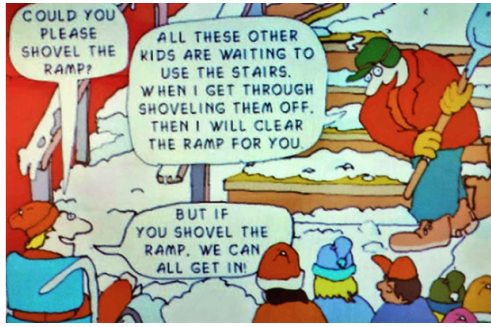

MAPL Program Launch

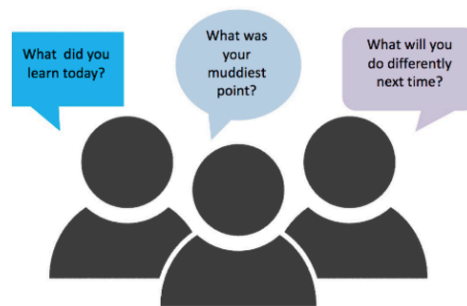
USF's new online Master of Arts in Public Leadership program has launched! With leadership in Washington, DC and San Francisco, the program is designed specifically for veterans and

THE NEW LOOK OF ECHO360

In January 2019, Echo360 will be making some big changes. The lecture capture system will be updating their video platform interface and content management features. The biggest changes will include a new library making it easier to manage all your video and presentation content, a new sharing model to enable easier content sharing, and a new video details page so you can see more pertinent information about your videos in a single view. These new features will be invaluable to our community by allowing instructors to view more detailed information about students who are interacting with the platform. WHAT'S NEW IN CANVAS?

Sharing Content with Another Instructor

Canvas makes it easy to share your Canvas course and content with another instructor. Adding your colleague to the course with the role of "copy" will allow that user to:

- See the structure and content of your course
- Import the entire course or just selected content directly into their own course.

The copy role will also prevent your colleague from easily modifying your original course and will prevent them from viewing any student grades or student information. Respondus Lockdown Browser

Instructors can use [Canvas Quizzing](#) to create assessments that check for student understanding. For more high stakes testing situations, consider enabling the [Respondus Lockdown Browser add on](#) for Canvas Quizzes. The Respondus browser locks down the testing

environment and prevents students from toggling to other applications or resources on their computer while taking a Canvas quiz.
