PRD Summary

Oppia currently has a classroom page for Math lessons, which is featured prominently and accessible via multiple pages:

- 1. Home Page > Browse our lessons
- 2. Navigation Bar > Learn
- 3. Community Library
- 4. <u>Learner Dashboard</u> (log-in required)

As more Oppia-curated content is developed (i.e. more classrooms created), there is a need to ensure that learners can easily access new content and classrooms as well. This PRD proposes the changes required on the site, for users to view and access multiple classrooms through the same access points (Navigation Bar, Community Library, and Learner Dashboard).

Note: Proposed solution should take into account web onboarding/lesson redesign (see Github issue)

Section 1: WHY

The aim of the WHY section is to demonstrate a good understanding of the problem we're trying to solve, why it's worth solving, and what's at stake if we don't solve it.

Problem Description

Target Audience	 Primary audience: Learners Secondary audience: Teachers and Parents who may be utilizing the content on the site to educate the learners
Core User Need	 As a learner, I want to be able to find official Oppia-curated content easily As a learner, I want to be able to select from, and learn about different topics (eg. Math, Science, English, etc)
Existing Status Quo	At the moment, there is only one Oppia curated classroom on the site (for Math), so learners can only access other lessons which are community-created through the Community Library
What goals do we want the solution to achieve?	Ability to access other Oppia curated classrooms (measured by clicks/page views on the various classrooms)

Summary of the proposed solution

The proposal is to have all Oppia classrooms linked and displayed to users on these pages for easy access and navigation:

- Home Page > Browse our lessons
- Navigation Bar > Learn
- Learner Dashboard (under "Learn Something New" as well as "Continue where you left off")
- Community Library
- Each classroom page

The classrooms that will be made available on Oppia are: Math (existing), Science (coming soon) and Financial Literacy (coming soon). Where content is not yet available/launched, a "classroom under construction" banner will be shown.

Note: The display of the classroom links should differ from page to page, depending on the style of the page.

Pros/Cons of the solution

Pros:

- Prominent display of classrooms Learners are made aware of, and able to access new curated topics
- Multiple access points to the classrooms
- Ability to track progress across multiple topics/classrooms

Cons:

- Not all lesson content will be ready upon the launch of multiple classrooms
 - → Mitigation: "classroom under construction" banner to be shown. Have at least the science/FinLit classroom ready before the launch of multiple classrooms.
- Learners may face some confusion when tracking progress on the Learner Dashboard if the classrooms/topics are not clearly displayed to them
 - Mitigation: have a clear segregation of topics on the dashboard to minimize confusion

[Web projects only] Impact on the Android app

Summary	This project changes user-generated content in the Android app.
Details	 New classroom pages and lessons need to be displayed on the Android app Need to provide users with navigation capabilities to select and move to different classrooms

Assumptions made

- Similar to Math lessons, progress will be tracked for learners accessing other topics/classrooms as well. The progress across classrooms will need to be shown on the Learner Dashboard as well.
- Either the Science or Financial Literacy lessons will be ready before the launch of multiple classrooms

Non-Goals

- This PRD will not address the timelines for which each classroom will be made available on the site.
- This PRD only proposes a set of classrooms to be displayed to users on day 1 of the launch. Additional classrooms may be added to the site at a later point in time following the same style / method.
